

Fitness at The Reef: What's New & What's Next

While it might seem cliché to talk about fitness at the start of the New Year, having just won 2024 Team of the Year, it just so happens to be the perfect time to cover some of the reasons why the Member Fitness Center received that distinction. If you've been to the Member Fitness Center, you know it's a bustling place for Members with machines, offerings and trainers galore (all of them busy with personal training or group fitness classes!). While this is not new, much of the innovative programming the team implemented last year and into this year is – a clear reason as to why their Member Satisfaction Score, derived from the annual Member satisfaction surveys, is so high at a 9.5 out of 10 (up .1 from 2023). Director of Fitness and Wellness Luis Bracamonte explained, "The Member Fitness Center has always offered special programming, but over the past couple years, we have really made it our mission to focus on overall wellness and bring in specialized trainers and offerings that are

unique and can appeal to a variety of Members no matter their fitness journey."

While programming is important, the Member Fitness Center's dedicated team of Associates is what really makes MFC a Member favorite. Alongside Luis is Fitness Trainer Manager Casey Culp. The two have worked together for 12 years and in that time, have developed a culture of getting to know the Membership, listening to their needs and goals and then delivering. They have successfully crafted a team of 32 expert Fitness Specialists (29 returning from last season), each selected with purposeful intent for their different specialties, from EMS and stretch therapy to golf fitness and Pilates, to literally put the "personal" in personalized training. The skills and experiences that each Fitness Specialist possesses makes for a well-rounded team and makes the variety of programming being offered possible.

WHAT'S TO COME

Listed are some of the exciting things to look out for in the New Year:

Shamrock 'n Roll Half Marathon & 10k

The holiday 5k runs, such as the Reindeer Run and the Bunny Hop, are among the most successful and memorable events at The Reef. The Shamrock 'n Roll Half Marathon and 10k aims to expand the Club's running event offerings to include longer distances. The event will be held on **March 15**, **2025** and will start and finish at the MFC parking lot.

Club Fitness Championship (CFC)

Now in its seventh edition, the CFC provides a platform for serious fitness competitors, while also welcoming Members of all fitness levels to participate. In this edition, we introduce two scoring systems: championship

scoring and challenge scoring. The championship category has stricter standards with points being awarded towards the CFC competition. The challenge category has technique requirements that allow all Members to take on the challenge, without the score going towards the overall CFC competition. Each CFC challenge offers a great opportunity to test and track progress over the years. They include Airdyne (November 2024), Swimming (December 2024), Push Up and C2 Row (January 2025), Rope Pulling and SkillRow Sled (February 2025), and Plank (March 2025).

Monthly Challenges

Members can participate in monthly challenges from January to March for different prizes. The challenges include the New Year Challenge (recording training hours) in January, the Ultra Challenge (miles on foot) in February, and the Ironman Challenge (swim, bike, and run miles and units) in March. Expanded Pilates Offerings

The MFC Pilates program continues to grow thanks to the quality of our instructors and equipment. This season, we added three more reformers and two more studio spaces.

Wellness Talks & Workshops

As in other years, we have built a calendar of talks and workshops covering crucial topics such as longevity, healthspan, muscle building for health, and resilience.

HIKE

This new 90-minute weekly specialty class aims to develop strength, endurance,

conditioning, and mobility. It is specifically designed for Members preparing for endurance events such as long hikes, marathons, and triathlons.

Floating Sound Bath

Members float comfortably on inflatable mattresses in the Fitness Pool, while the instructor "bathes" them in sound - the ultimate relaxation.

New EMS Room

After two very successful seasons, the Electro Muscular Stimulation System (EMS) has a room of its own located on the first floor of the MFC. The EMS system effectively and efficiently increases muscle strength and tone with less stress on the joints.

A Bittersweet Farewell: Honoring Rev. Dr. Robert W. Henley

The Congregation Ocean Reef (COR) invites the community to two special events celebrating the incredible contributions of Rev. Dr. Robert Henley (affectional known as Rev. Bob). These gatherings, taking place on Friday, January 10 at 6 p.m. and Sunday, January 12 at 10:20 a.m., will honor Rev. Bob's enduring impact on Ocean Reef's Jewish and broader spiritual community.

Rev. Bob, a retired
Presbyterian pastor, has been
the Chaplain-in-Residence at
Ocean Reef Club since 2014.
Alongside his wife, Jane, he has
faithfully served congregations
in California, Kansas, and Idaho,
bringing a lifetime of ministry
and wisdom to Ocean Reef.
As they prepare to embark
on a new chapter, it is only
fitting to pause and reflect on
the profound ways they have
blessed our community.

From the moment Bob and Jane arrived, their warmth and humility allowed them to connect deeply with Ocean Reef's diverse community. Early in his tenure, Rev. Bob embraced opportunities to support and build bridges with the Jewish community. His first Passover Seder attendance in 2014 marked the beginning of meaningful relationships with Jewish leaders at Ocean Reef.

The following year, he supported an interfaith study of the book "Our Father Abraham: Jewish Roots of the Christian Faith." This text highlights the shared spiritual ancestry between Judaism and Christianity, tracing its roots to Abraham. The study brought together Jews and Christians in a spirit of mutual

respect and exploration, laying the foundation for a thriving interfaith connection.

Bob's vision, passion, and commitment to shared Judeo-Christian values.

Rev. Bob's ministry has exemplified the unifying message found in scripture. The Bible reminds us in Psalm 133:1, "How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" His work has underscored the deep connections between our faith traditions, rooted in a shared heritage and the divine teachings passed down from Abraham.


The upcoming events will celebrate this legacy. On Friday, January 10, the Jewish Sabbath service and will feature a special devotional honoring Rev. 
Rev. Bob has selected five passages, which he will read in

Looking Ahead to 2025: Key Updates & Events

As we welcome the new year, the Ocean Reef Community Association (ORCA) is thrilled to share updates and plans for 2025.

To keep Members informed and address any questions, a Town Hall Meeting is scheduled for **Friday**, **January 10 at 9 a.m. in Town Hall**, providing Members an opportunity to stay informed on important community updates and other topics of interest.

Here's what Members can look forward to in the months ahead:

Sunrise Cay Bridge Project Progress

The Sunrise Cay Bridge repair

project continues to advance ahead of schedule. However, recent asphalt milling revealed that the aged bottom layer of asphalt was no longer bonded to the concrete, requiring additional work that will slightly offset the earlier gains. Asphalt reapplication for one-third of the bridge is set for early January, with the

remainder to be completed within the first quarter of the year.

Also beginning this month, a second contractor will commence an 11-month project to install protective jackets on 167 underwater piles, enhancing the bridge's durability and lifespan. Homeowners should not experience disruptions during this phase of construction.

ORCA Sponsored Presentations

ORCA's sponsored presentations will continue into 2025, bringing valuable information to Members. Upcoming events include a Monroe County Property Appraiser visit on Wednesday, January 22 and another by the Monroe County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) on Monday, February 24. Details will follow soon.

Grayvik Animal Center Construction

Construction of the new Grayvik Animal Center, Home of ORCAT, is progressing well, with exterior walls now going up. This vital project will establish a world-class veterinary facility, meeting Ocean Reef's growing demand for exceptional medical care and grooming services for pets. It will also support ORCAT, our nonprofit Trap-Neuter-Release (TNR) program. ORCA will share continued updates as milestones are achieved.

Public Safety Training Schedule



Tequila has seen explosive growth in recent years, with no signs of slowing down. Thanks to brands like Clase Azul and Casamigos (thanks, George Clooney!), the spirit has gained a reputation for being smoother and more refined than ever before.

For many years, tequila had a bad reputation, largely due to the presence of inferior products tarnishing the spirits image. Many have had "that one night" where we swore off tequila. But times are changing. As more people discover the exceptional quality of high-end tequila, we're realizing it can be a delightful drink that, when enjoyed in moderation, doesn't lead to a night we'd rather forget.

In addition to its smoother profile, tequila has benefited from a growing awareness of the health benefits linked to agave, the plant from which tequila is derived. That said, I'm no doctor, and I haven't seen any studies proving that tequila is healthier than other spirits. As always, it's best to adhere to the golden rule of alcohol consumption: moderation is key.

What I find most fascinating about tequila is the incredible variety it offers. Tequila is one of the most regulated spirit categories, with strict guidelines governing production and labeling. By law, tequila must be made from at least 51% Blue Agave. However, tequila made from 100% Blue Agave is the highest quality and should be your go-to choice. If a bottle simply says "Tequila" without the "100% Blue Agave" label, it's likely a mixto, which contains

lower-quality ingredients.

Tequila also comes in different styles, each with its own distinct flavor profile:

- Blanco (Silver): Unaged, offering the purest expression of agave.
- Joven (Gold): A blanco Tequila that has been colored or may contain additional additives.
- Reposado: Aged in oak for a minimum of 2 months, giving it a smoother, more complex flavor.
- Añejo: Aged for at least 12 months in oak, resulting in a richer and more refined taste.
- Extra Añejo: Aged for a minimum of 3 years, delivering a deep, robust profile.

Recently, newer styles like Rosé and Joven have emerged, but we'll save those for another discussion!

The flavor of tequila is also deeply influenced by where it's grown. While tequila can only be produced in five Mexican states, Jalisco is the most well-known region.
Mezcal, on the other hand, has a broader geographical range in Mexico (with Oaxaca being its epicenter) and can be made from a wider variety of agave plants, giving each Mezcal a unique flavor profile based on the terroir of its region.

A Great Investment

If you've been an investor this past year, the value of your portfolio reflects how we have benefited from the rise in the stock market. But there has been another significant upturn during the same period, an important one that likely went unnoticed.

A Remarkable Trend

A recent news article reported that sales of the Bible have risen like the stock market. In the first ten months of this year, sales of the Bible have grown more than twenty-two percent, with almost fourteen million copies being sold.

When asked how to explain this significant increase, Catholic Bishop Robert Barron responded that he thinks it reflects a hunger in the culture today – a hunger for truth, for purpose, for meaning, and a sense of direction for our lives. He said it also reflects an instinctive realization that we know where to turn to fulfill that hunger, that longing – to the Bible.

Bishop Barron observed that many have turned away from the claims of the "new atheism" that labeled faith in God irrelevant and unnecessary. He went on to identify the big questions many are asking in these unsettling, uncertain, turbulent times. He said people want to know "What's going on?" "Who do we trust?" "What do we turn to?"

Other Indicators

There are other 'leading indicators' of this trend worth note. First is the popularity of the series on the life and ministry of Jesus, "The Chosen." The series is one of the most

widely watched television series in the world, with over two hundred million viewers globally.

There has also been the growth of the prayer app, "Hallow." Since it came out in 2018, the app has been downloaded more than two million times. Millions have watched Jason Roumie and Mark Wahlberg model meaningful prayer in brief televised commercial segments.

We've all seen the "Jesus Gets Us" ad campaign. While roundly criticized by all sides, the ads have asserted that Jesus is the answer to the most conflicted, controversial issues of our time.

And finally, there is the popularity of the movie, "The Best Christmas Pageant Ever." Released this past November, the film rose to number three in box office revenue and received a ninety-eight percent audience approval on Rotten Tomatoes.

What might this mean? While I'm certainly not a trained sociologist, some changes stand out that have hopefully contributed to this development.

Embracing the Whole Story

For many years, the cleanest pages of most Christian's Bibles were the first two-thirds of the book called, The Old Testament - better referred to as the First Testament or the Hebrew Scriptures.

However, when watching any of the episodes of The Chosen, you realize the context of Jesus' story in the Gospels is rooted in the faith and life of the Jewish people. That history is found in the Hebrew Scriptures of the Tanakh – the Torah, the *Nevi'im* or Prophets, and the *Ketuvim*, or the Writings. In fact, Jesus' life and teaching can't be fully understood apart from his Jewish context during the Second Temple period of history.

Without ignoring our differences, embracing the Hebraic roots of Christian faith has been one of the most important developments since the Holocaust, or the Shoah. So too has been the rejection of the many debunked anti-Semitic tropes. Too often, these have been voiced by parts of the church in the past, as they are in the diabolical global rise of anti-Semitism today. Further, the nature of most Jewish-Christian relationships today does not and need not reflect the hostility and antipathy found in the pages of the New Testament.

The Changing Face of the Church

The past four decades have seen the decline of what were known as the 'mainline' Christian denominations, now called the 'oldline.' This is in part an understandable historical development.

When our nation was founded, the First Amendment Establishment Clause prohibited the government from making a law "respecting the establishment of religion or prohibiting the exercise thereof." This establishes freedom of religion, not freedom from. Faith has always had the right to a place, a voice in the public square.

The question during the colonial period was, "How will people of faith denominate themselves from one another in this new land?" Our Christian forebearers had come from countries in Europe with established state churches. The development of denominations was the answer to their question. However, that often

devolved into a negative competitive comparison - 'my brand is better than your brand' – contrary to the very prayer of Jesus for his church.

Recent decades have seen dynamic change in the face of the Church. These developments and trends may indicate the hunger for a meaningful faith, one grounded in God's story in Scripture. Hopefully, it reflects a desire for an underlying unity of faith and belief – yet one that allows for and honors a diversity of particularity in praxis.

Encouragement for the New Year

As you think about your goals for the coming New Year, let me encourage you to consider reading through the Bible. There are several plans you can find online and in different print versions – both formatted to be read in a year's time. If you're a new to the Bible, consider a readable paraphrase or translation like the New Living Translation, or the Message, or the New International Version.

As you read, remember that it's God's story. Like any great story it has a beginning and a conclusion. In between, the story unfolds like most of our lives, with the good, the bad, and the ugly. But God's story contains the answers to those deepest questions. So let me encourage you to dig in and hopefully, find your deepest hunger satisfied in a vital life of faith. You'll find it a great investment, maybe the best!



Born in 1850 in Italy, Francesca Cabrini overcame a challenging start in life to leave a lasting impact on the world. The youngest of thirteen children, she faced health struggles and hardship early on. Despite this, she pursued an education, eventually becoming a teacher and a Catholic nun.

Arriving in New York City in 1889 at the behest of Pope Leo XIII, Cabrini encountered widespread disease, crime,



and poverty among Italian immigrants. Undeterred by language barriers, lack of funds, and hostility from the local political and Church hierarchy, she found ways to reach out to the press and sympathetic donors. Cabrini helped establish 67 missions in the US, Latin America, and Europe including schools for the poor, orphanages, and hospitals that would treat immigrants. Her

work provided much-needed care for the sick and poor, long before government social services were available.

Mother Cabrini became a U.S. citizen in 1909 and was canonized in 1946, becoming the first American citizen to be recognized as a saint. Today, she is remembered as the patron saint of immigrants, symbolizing hope and resilience. Her name lives on through schools, hospitals, and other landmarks, a lasting reminder of her dedication to helping those in need.

New Yorkers affectionately recognize her as the "patron saint of finding a parking space," a testament to her approachable and enduring spirit. Celebrate her inspiring life by attending a special complimentary screening of "Cabrini" at the Cultural Center on **Tuesday**, **January 14**, at 7:30 p.m. This powerful film promises to move and inspire audiences.

Shrimp Panzanella Salad



by Betania Salles, Carysfort Kitchen Chef de Cuisine

For me, Panzanella is one of the hidden gems in Italian Cuisine. Not everyone likes it but those who get a chance to try a nicely done Panzanella, they always fall in love with it.

This version gets beautiful shrimp from Tampa Bay, they are pink and sweet, just like the ones you find in Italy, but if you are not able to get these, the Key West Pink Shrimp will do it.

SHRIMP PANZANELLA SALAD

(Serves 6)

Ingredients:

- 18 ea. Tampa sun shrimp, shell on, deveined
- 2 cups crusty bread, large diced, lightly toasted with olive oil
- 1/4 cup olive oil + 1/4 cup
- 1 tbsp lemon juice
- 3 tbsps. red wine vinegar
- 1 medium shallot, minced
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp black peppercorn, freshly ground
- 3 cups Cucumber, medium diced
- 1/2 cup yellow bell pepper, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup red onion, thinly sliced
- 4 cups Roma tomatoes, cored and medium diced
- 3 tbsps. basil, chopped
- 2 tbsps. parsley, chopped
- 1/4 cup olives, sliced
- 1 1/2 tbsp capers

Directions:

- Fill up a medium pot with water, season with salt (it should taste like ocean water), bring it to boil.
- Add shrimp to boiling salted water and cook for 2 minutes, stirring a couple times.
- Turn off the fire and let the shrimp stand in the water for 1 more minute. Strain it and place it in the refrigerator. Once shrimp is cold, remove the shell.
- In a medium size mixing bowl, toss shrimp with 1 tbsp lemon juice and 1/4 cup of olive oil.
- In a small mixing bowl, combine the 1/4 cup of olive oil, red wine vinegar, shallots, and salt and pepper.
 Whisk well.
- In a large mixing bowl, combine the cucumber, bell peppers, onions, tomatoes, olives, capers, herbs and bread. Pour in the dressing and toss well.
- Gently fold the marinated shrimp into the salad.



Adventures to the Talachulitna River

The first week of September, my son Michael and I traveled to the Talaheim Lodge outside of Skwentna, Alaska on the Talachulitna River. Its uniqueness is that it uses helicopters to fly guests to the various fishing locations. The lodge is all handmade, heated by wood burning stoves and only hosts eight anglers per week

The owner is a true Alaskan pioneer. He landed his J3 Cub on a small sandbar on the upper Talachulitna River at age 22, and decided it looked like a good spot for a lodge.

He learned to fly helicopters in the mid 80smid-80s and paid for his passion by flying clients into remote areas to hunt moose, bear, and dall sheep. He also gave rides at the state fairs, and would fly veterinarians to the check points at the Iditarod race to care for wounded dogs. He also herded reindeer for the local ranchers that raised them for the tasty meat and sold the antlers to China.

So for the next six days my son and I fished the remote rivers of the area. The helicopters would drop you off and arrange to pick you up at a designated area that evening. Two of the days we had inflatable rafts that we would float with and stop at different areas to fish. A couple of the rivers had Sockeye Salmon. As we quickly learned, the Alaskan Brown Bear also wants to catch the Sockeye. A cousin to the Grizzly, the full grown males can reach 1500lbs. You rotated guides each day but each had a 10 millimeter Glock pistol. The guides instructed you to be very aware of the bears. "Sometimes you can hear them walking in the brush, but normally you can smell them first," one of the guides was telling us. "Where we fish, there is only perfectly clean air. So if you ever smell something like a garbage dump, come and tell me quickly."

So one day we were hiking a

river. This was the river with the most sockeye. My son had moved further down the river, when he came running back. "I smelled it" he said. I asked, "You smelled what?" Michael said, "The garbage dump." Our guide immediately pulled out the 10 millimeter from the chest holster, and cocked it so a bullet was in the chamber, he held up his hand for us to remain still. He and Michael could hear the bear in the brush, but luckily it was moving away.


After a few minutes, the coast was clear. I asked our guide if he had ever had to shoot a bear. He said he had not. He had only had to fire two warning shots. The guide said, "These 10 millimeters are really loud, both times the bears ran away. Plus they are totally focused on the salmon, they don't need to eat us with so many fish right now."

So my son and I spent six glorious days in the Alaska wilderness, catching Dolly Varden, Rainbow Trout, Sockeye Salmon, Chum Salmon, Pink Salmon, and Arctic Grayling, and getting to fly around in the Enstrom helicopters.

I think my son said it best, "Dad, it was another trip of a lifetime."

Transitioning From Baseline

beneficial. The mallet should be swung from the shoulders to minimize wrist and elbow movement, and adequately engaging the core and pelvic floor muscles provides the striker with a stable foundation from which to hit. Exercises to improve include Pilates for

the core and pelvic floor, yoga for balance and flexibility, and strength training for muscle and control and force production. Combining these modalities provides croquet players with an improved ability to maintain a more stable hitting stand, move through more optimal



ranges of motion, and increase their capacity to exert force with the upper body.

A Tide in the Affairs of Mariners

"There is a tide in the affairs of [mariners], which, taken at the flood, leads on to fortune; omitted, all the voyage of their life is bound in shallows and in miseries." If Shakespeare's Brutus were navigating the Florida Keys, he might continue "... and be stuck in the mud with an expensive repair."

At Ocean Reef we experience mixed semi-diurnal tides, two high and two low tides of dissimilar sizes daily. Tidal range is quite different on the Atlantic flank of the Keys from that within Florida Bay. NOAA establishes the average tidal range for the Ocean Reef Marina on the Atlantic at 2.3 feet while for Pumpkin Key, on the bay side, it is merely 0.65 feet.

The distinction arises because the Atlantic is a show-off, and her open waters allow for the full expression of tidal cycles, whereas within the shy and shallow sounds semi-enclosed geography and narrow channels restrict tidal swing. Strong reversing currents in the channels running from ocean to bay create a lively tidal dialogue.

Tide levels in the US are measured relative to the reference point of Mean Lower Low Water, (MLLW) adopted by NOAA in 1980, which means "this is about as low as it gets, usually." Of course, tides can and do fall lower than "usually" during "minus tides" when waters ebb below MLLW.

This is not the case in Canada

which politely avoids negative numbers and applies a reference point based on Lower Low Water Large Tide (LLWLT), meaning "this is really as low as it gets, eh?" In Britain, well never mind - discussing our cross-the-pond cousins' arcane tidal datums is like learning the rules of cricket.

When traveling the shallow

Intracoastal Waterway within the Keys, tidal range is small, but depths can fall a large percentage of the available water, particularly during minus tides or when offshore winds push water out of the bay.

Within the Florida Keys fortunes in the affairs of mariners are bound to the tide tables.





- 9. High-intensity exercise increases Brain-Derived Neurotropic Factor (BDNF), a protein crucial for the growth and survival of brain cells, leading to improved cognitive function.
- 10. Sleep is essential to well-being. Good quality sleep has many benefits, including boosting the immune system, regulating hormones, removing toxins from the brain, and consolidating memories and new information.
- Personal trainers provide knowledge, guidance, motivation, and accountability.





10 Ways to Hit the Ground Better



"Swing Tip"

I would say one of the top things I work on with students is learning to hit the grass better. I have a lot of people who do not want to make a mess. Our superintendent Eric is incredibly amazing at his job and will not be upset if you make a divot!

If you struggle with making the ball go up in the air consistently or are searching for a way to compress the ball better, then these tips would be helpful.

10 WAYS TO HIT THE GROUND BETTER:

1. Posture

This is the most simple and best way to accomplish this. If you're not hitting the ground then you may be standing too upright which pulls your chest and arms away from the ground. Bow more forward from the waist to allow your arms to hang below your shoulders. This puts you closer to the ground and makes it easier to brush the grass.

2. Don't hit the towel

Putting a rolled up towel outside the ball forces the club to work in a more downward motion towards the grass. Bonus is this drill works on path too!

3. Throw the ball

I use this drill a lot. Take a golf ball and for a right handed golfer let your right elbow bend and throw a ball straight down to the ground. A similar motion would be like you're bouncing a tennis ball down to the ground. The lead arm should straighten to make the ball go in the air.

4. Go to the beach

Head to a bunker and just take swings getting comfortable hitting the ground. Some simply need to know its A Okay to make a mess! Another great way to do this is go to a fairway bunker and take an iron and hit balls. We have one here on the range and you are more than welcome to use it!

5. Little Tee

Having a focal point when hitting can be very helpful. This can be done in practice or on the course if you're not playing in a match or event. Tee up the ball very low and try to put your focus on sweeping the tee out not hitting the ball. Aim lower than the golf ball.

6. Relax


It's easier said than done, but relax your shoulders and elbows. Your grip pressure should not be a 12/10. Too much tension and the club will never reach the ground. This also plays into posture, once you're hinged forward allow your arms to hang and be tension-free like an elephant's trunk.

7. The Rough

Hitting balls out of thick rough can be really helpful. Lots of grass is less scary and it can be a motivator to try to hit the ground more to pop the ball out.

8. One-handed

To help get a better feeling take your lead arm (right for a

right-handed golfer) and just take small swings one-handed trying to make the club thump on the ground. Then add a ball, it's really hard to help the ball in the air with one arm and by separating one arm from the other it can change what you are focusing on. This drill pairs nicely as a second part to the throwing down the ball drill.

9. Shorter is not always better

I know a lot of us start to make the club shorter because we feel like it provides more control but if you're really struggling to hit the ground make sure you haven't made the club so short it can't reach the turf. Hopefully you had a chance to have your

clubs fitted for you which means they are already the correct length and you don't need to make them shorter!

10. Forget Racquet Sports for a minute

Hannah and Justin will have to forgive me but put tennis and pickle out of your mind once you put a golf club in your hand. Racquet sports require a low to high motion which moves you away from the ground. Golf is high to low. Straight down into the ground. You do not help the ball in the air in golf. You make the club go in a downward motion towards the ground to make the ball go up.



BRIDGE TIP

Does the 5-Level Belong to the Opponents?

by Gregg Van Dyke, Bridge Director

To bid to make at the 5-level, you need:

- Offensive values extra high-card points, extra trumps
- A source of outside tricks
 a long side suit, or extra trumps and ruffing values
- Controls (aces, kings and singletons) in outside suits
- Very important: Control of their suit (singleton, ace or sometimes Kx)

Words of wisdom:

The 5-level belongs to the opponents. Be very slow to jeopardize the possible plus position you create when you push the opponents to the 5-level. If the decision is close whether to push on, double them, or pass -- then you should pass.

If you push on and go for too much, or it is a phantom, or you double them and they make it, you have a terrible result. If you double them and beat them one, you may have gained little or nothing. If you pass, in most cases the worst that will happen to you is that you break even.

This is almost analogous to a statement made by Daryl Royal: "If the (foot)ball is in the air, only three things can happen, and two of them are bad."

[Excerpted from "Rules of Bridge" by Grant Baze, published in 1985.]

To sacrifice at the 5-level, you need:

- Extra trumps usually a fit of at least 10 trumps
- Distributional values a singleton in their suit (best) or other suits
- Very few defensive tricks (keep in mind that queens and jacks in your shorter suits may be tricks on

- defense)
- The expectation that you can take 10 tricks (red vs. white), 9 tricks (at equal vulnerability) or 8 tricks (white vs. red)
- The strong expectation that the opponents will make their game contract.

Estimating tricks for a sacrifice

If partner has preempted and you're deciding whether or not to sacrifice, estimate partner's playing strength by using the **Rule of 2, 3 & 4**. Assume partner will have the playing tricks to be within 2, 3 or 4 tricks of making his bid, depending on the vulnerability and that virtually all of his winners are in his trump suit. Here's a summary of how to apply the Rule of 2, 3 & 4 (See table).

In practice, partner's preempt could be a bit light at favorable vulnerability (he may "stretch" the Rule of 4, especially in third seat). He'll tend to be more careful when vulnerable (he may not bid with a marginal Rule of 3 hand when both sides are vulnerable).

If partner opens or overcalls a weak two at:

Favorable vulnerability (white vs. red) – he'll usually have 4 winners and 9 losers (sometimes 5 winners, 8 losers) (**Rule of 4** to bid at the 8-trick level).

Equal vulnerability (white vs. white **or** red vs. red) – he'll have 5-6 winners and 7-8 losers (**Rule of 3**).

Unfavorable vulnerability (red vs. not) – he'll have 6 winners and 7 losers (**Rule of 2**).

If partner opens or overcalls a preemptive three-bid at:

Favorable vulnerability – he'll have 5 winners and 8 losers (sometimes 6 winners, 7 losers) (**Rule of 4** to bid at the 9-trick level).


Equal vulnerability – he'll have 6-7 winners and 6-7 losers (**Rule of 3**).

Unfavorable vulnerability – he'll have 7 winners and 6 losers (**Rule of 2**).

Before you make a sacrifice bid, always:

- Count your tricks on offense. Add the number of high-card and playing tricks in your hand to your estimate of partner's playing tricks. Look at the vulnerability and decide if you can afford the penalty when the opponents double.
- Count your tricks on defense. Estimate the number of defensive tricks
- you might take against the opponents' contract. If partner opened or overcalled a Weak 2-bid, assume he'll take one defensive trick (perhaps two, depending on your length in his suit). If partner made a 3-bid, assume he'll take zero or one defensive trick.
- If you have doubts about the success of the opponent's game contract or your sacrifice, pass.


