Gotta Question?

At Ocean Reef, is it appropriate for bikers to ride against traffic or with traffic?

The rules of the road for cyclists, as established by Florida Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (FLHSMV), says that cyclists should ride in the same direction as traffic and stay as far to the right as possible, using bike lanes whenever available. This too goes for Ocean Reef, whether riding in the car lane or golf cart lane.

Bicyclists should also obey all traffic laws, including signs, signals and lane markings, when riding on the roadway.

Additional guidelines provided by FLHSMV apply to those driving a car or golf cart:

• Drivers must give bicyclists



a minimum of three feet of clearance when driving alongside or passing them.

- When turning, yield to any bicyclist in the car or cart lane and make your turn behind the cyclist.
- Avoid using high beam headlights when you see a bicyclist approaching.
- Before opening a car door, check for bicyclists who may be approaching from behind.

releases and Reef Cup hasn't seen more than 300 releases since 2011. This is now the fourth highest number of releases in Reef Cup history.

While some boats came back with no flags and others with too many to count on Day One, it was an enthusiastic start to Reef Cup with 125 sailfish caught – a number that hasn't been seen on Day One since 2011. The success of Day One set the stage for what the rest of the tournament would look like. From a shared tradition to a thrilling come from behind win, this year's Reef Cup had everyone on the edge of their seats

This year would change all that.

The first day of fishing landed Team Priceless in 13th place with 400 points – half that of the teams in first and second place.

The team took their lay day on Day Two to regroup with some bait-fishing, proving the sport of fishing is not just about competition for the Sanchez team, but a true passion.

Team Priceless ended Day Three in a whopping 23rd place. It's safe the say the team was not at the top of anyone's list to win the tournament but, Reef Cup proved once again that it really is anyone's tournament up until the very end.

Day Four is when Team Priceless made the critical decision to switch to outrigger, finally hitting the jackpot. Priceless had their first fish that day at 12:40 p.m., and in an exciting turn of events, reeled in 10 sailfish in the span of three hours which meant one every 10 to 20 minutes.

"The moment I realized we could win the Reef Cup was around 3 p.m. on the final day," said Jorge Jr. "We were head to head with **Mike Levy's** Team Buckalot. I believe we had them by one point, but they had been fighting a fish for a long time. That last hour was a rollercoaster ride."

In the end, Team Buckalot lost their fish, effectively securing the come-from-behind win for Team Priceless. When asked what point was the most exciting for the Priceless team, Jorge Jr. said the moment "lines out" were called and they knew the tournament win was theirs.

How'd the team celebrate their win? "Victory cigar, of course," said Jorge Jr.

While the competition is always exciting, and this year especially, for this father-son team it's the family tradition that is really their favorite part of the tournament. And to end the 40th Annual with their first win together?

Priceless.



- Turn on headlights at night for visibility. Avoid late-night joyrides.
- Drive cautiously, following all traffic laws and designated paths.
- Register the vehicle with ORCA Public Safety and display the decal.
- Follow passenger limits and avoid overcrowding.
- Alert passengers before turning to prevent injuries.

• Alcohol & Identification:

The legal drinking age in Florida is 21. Venues at Ocean Reef will request proper identification, and Members could face fines if their guests use fake IDs.

passengers cannot adequately protect a child they are holding in the event of an accident.

One option for families with

young children is an easilyinstalled (and removed) harness designed especially for golf carts to help provide safety for little ones in both the front and back seats of a cart.

Now I can take them to Buccaneer Island or Reef Treats alone with confidence that we all will travel safely. Members can do research and find whatever products meet their specific needs. Achilles Tendinitis

Tennis, pickleball, basketballmany of the court sports can be rough on feet and legs. If you are experiencing tenderness or pain, be careful not to overdo it and be aware of how Achilles tendinitis can present.

Achilles tendinitis typically begins as a mild ache in the back of the leg or above the heel after sports activities. Achilles tendinitis is caused by repetitive or intense strain on the Achilles tendon, the band of tissue that connects your calf muscles to your heel bone. This tendon is used when you walk, run, jump or push up on your toes.

The structure of the Achilles tendon can weaken with age, which can make it more susceptible to injury.

Risk factors

Several factors may increase your risk of Achilles tendinitis, including:

- Being a male.
- Age related risk.
- A naturally flat arch in your foot can put more strain on the Achilles tendon. Obesity and tight calf muscles also can increase tendon strain.
- Running in worn-out shoes can increase your risk.
 Tendon pain occurs more

frequently in cold weather than in warm weather and running on hilly terrain also can predispose you to injury.

- People who have psoriasis or high blood pressure.
- Certain types of antibiotics, called fluoroquinolones, have been associated with higher rates of risk.
- Achilles tendinitis can weaken the tendon, making it more vulnerable to a tear (rupture) — a painful injury

that usually requires surgical repair.

Prevention

Increase your activity level gradually. If you're beginning an exercise regimen, start slowly and gradually increase the duration and intensity of the training.

Avoid activities that place excessive stress on your tendons, such as hill running. If you notice pain during a particular exercise, stop and rest.

The shoes you wear while exercising should provide adequate cushioning for your heel and should have a firm arch support to help reduce the tension in the Achilles tendon.

Take the time to stretch and strengthen your calf muscles to better enable them to handle the stresses they encounter from activity and exercises.

All Our Differences

Like most everyone in this community, it has been my privilege to visit dozens of countries and to interact with people from many walks of life. I've worked on an offshore oilrig, in a maximum-security prison, in the world corporate headquarters of IBM, and on a farm. I've known an Ecuadorean woman who literally lived in a hole in the ground and an American man who used a golfcart to get from one end of the inside of his palatial home to the other.

People's life experiences

can be so very different. The lens through which people come to look at the world is, correspondingly, diverse. Even simple words like "mother" or "America" or "club" can invoke widely varying responses based on someone's storyline. No wonder people don't always see eye-to-eye or struggle to get along.

E Pluribus Unum

In light of all this, the Latin motto on our currency, "out of many one," can seem a bit unrealistic. Nonetheless, I hope we will not give it up. For all that genuinely separates us, there is so much more that unites us.

Certainly, our *biology* does. For all the surface distinctions, we share 99.9% of our DNA with everyone else we meet. Our ecology is another uniting reality. Astronauts and astrophysicists alike say that once you get out into space it becomes clear how rare is this little blue and green marble on

which we live and what a gift to be alive on it.

But there's something else that ties us together with people from different races and religions, economic and experiential conditions. We are united by "Our Longings."

The Big Five

Psychologist, Abraham Maslow, posited that once someone has satisfied the basic requirements for their physiological and safety needs, they move on to seeking to fulfill a higher level of desires. Let me name Five Longings in particular that I've noticed seem to link almost everyone I've met across the years, spheres and continents.

- To love and be loved.
 Human beings seem
 hardwired to connect.
 We find our greatest joy
 and wealth in meaningful
 relationships where we are
 welcome, known and loved
 and can offer that to others.
- To grow in grace and truth. Few of us want to get "stuck" in our development.
 We want to keep growing in our character and wisdom.
 For this reason, all but the most unusually ignorant of us strive to be lifelong learners.
- To give a gift that matters.

 Deep within most of us is desire to bring something of value to the party of life, to be a valued contributor to each circle we enter, and to leave those places better

because we were there.

- To sow a seed that continues. Many of us seem bound to leave some graffiti on the wall of time, saying "I was here." We write books and do works of art. We work to raise up families or businesses or institutions. We plant trees whose shade we will never sit under to leave a legacy of ongoing good.
- To sing a song of joy. No matter our temperament, we want our life to be a dance not a dirge. We yearn to hear and move to the deepest, most beautiful notes of life. We seek to have days filled with inspiration and not just industry.

Can You Relate?

Which of those longings rings a responsive chord in you and why? Where do you see these impulses expressed in your life? Is there a yearning that needs to be pursued further in days ahead? I encourage you to share this article with a spouse or a child, a friend or co-worker, and ask how they might respond to these questions.

We are so much more alike than we are different. We share some deep desires. Theologians have sometimes called these "the image and likeness of God" in us. These longings are put there to lead us to the best kind of life. Let's support each other in finding that life.



Jimmy was proud to be a 50-year Member of the Club and served it well, from the ORC Membership Committee, MGA Golf Committee, Landings Condo Assn President, Medical Center "Fun Raiser" Marshall, and even a singer/dancer in the Ocean Reef Follies - and, of course, he will always be remembered as the Voice of the Bag Room Open. Jim fell in love with golf in his teens after earning his first dollar



as a caddy at the Country Club of Maryland. In 1969, he and some ambitious golfers started the Towson Golf and Country Club in northern Baltimore County, where he served as its first president. 

Water Quality Testing in the Florida Keys:

Uncovering the Impact of Nitrogen Pollution

On Thursday, February 20, Research Professor Dr. Brian Lapointe from Florida Atlantic University (FAU) and his team, Greer Babbe and Ocean Webber, joined forces with The Dive Shop to conduct critical water quality testing in the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary. This initiative is part of an ongoing effort to understand nutrient pollution's impact on the region's delicate marine ecosystems.

Dr. Lapointe has been studying the Florida Bay and the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary since the 1990s. His research focuses on utilizing stable nitrogen isotopes to "fingerprint" nitrogen sources, helping to trace the origins of nitrogen pollution. This method has been instrumental in revealing the significant role of agricultural nitrogen from mainland sources in fueling harmful algal blooms in the Keys.

During this round of testing, six out of 10 planned sites throughout the Keys marine sanctuaries were examined. The team collected water and algae samples, which were taken back to the lab to analyze for nitrogen, phosphorus, and sucralose — a chemical marker directly linked to human waste. In addition, they measured several key water quality parameters on-site, including:

- pH Levels Indicating the acidity or alkalinity of the water.
- **Dissolved Oxygen** Crucial for the survival of marine life.
- **Temperature** Influences coral health and the

prevalence of algal blooms.

 Light Measurement & Turbidity – Determining water clarity and how much light penetrates to the ocean floor, impacting the growth of seagrasses and corals.

One of the findings from the recent testing was the high levels of sucralose present in the water, highlighting the impact of human waste on the marine environment. This is a stark reminder of how interconnected our water systems are and how human activities on land can have far-reaching consequences on ocean health.

Humans have more than doubled the amount of reactive nitrogen entering the environment, largely from human waste and agricultural runoff. This excess nitrogen is particularly harmful to coral reefs, contributing to stress and increasing the risk of coral bleaching.

Florida has made significant

strides in reducing fertilizer runoff, achieving more than a 60% reduction since 2003. However, with the state's growing population, nitrogen levels in coastal waters remain high. In extreme weather events such as hurricanes and heavy rainfall, excess nitrogen is carried south through the watershed, promoting harmful algal blooms that threaten the delicate balance of the marine ecosystem.

The findings from Dr. Lapointe's team underscore the urgent need for continued water quality monitoring and proactive measures to reduce nitrogen pollution. Protecting the Florida Keys' vibrant marine life and iconic coral reefs depends on addressing nutrient pollution at its source.

The work conducted by Dr. Lapointe, his team, and partners like The Dive Shop plays a critical role in safeguarding these underwater ecosystems for future generations.



Chef Betania's Kitchen

Veal Piccata (Serves 2)



by Betania Salles, Carysfort Kitchen Chef de Cuisine

A tradition and popular dish in Italy and super requested at our Italian restaurant, Gianni, the Veal Piccata is a must have dish. This simple but delicious dish is everyone's favorite, the lemony sauce combined with capers makes the meat so flavorful.

You can serve over angel hair pasta or with sautéed spinach.

Ingredients:

- 12 oz veal loin, portion into 4 pieces (3 oz each), pounded
- 1/2 tbsp salt
- 1/2 tsp black peppercorn, freshly ground
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour

- 3 tbsp extra virgin olive oil
- 3 tbsp white wine
- 1 1/2 tbsp lemon juice
- 1/2 cup chicken or beef broth
- 2 tbsp capers
- 1oz butter
- 2 tbsp chopped parsley

Directions:

- Season the veal with salt and pepper, lightly coat with flour.
- Heat up olive oil in a large sauté pan at medium heat. Sear meat on both sides for about 40 seconds each side. Don't let the drips in the pan burn, we need that to make our sauce.
- Transfer the meat to a plate and reserve.
- Pour the white wine into the pan, let it reduce for 20 seconds. Add lemon juice, broth and capers, reduce the heat. Simmer for 30 seconds.
- Bring the meat back into the pan and keep simmering for a minute or until liquid is reduced to half. Turn off heat.
- Add butter and parsley, stir well until butter is melted and sauce is slightly thick. Adjust seasoning if necessary.





PICKLEBALL TIP

All About the Serve



by Alex Mabred, Head Pickleball Professional

Dear Pickleball players, this week's tip focuses on the serve. One common issue I observe is that many players tend to keep their heads elevated as they prepare to serve. Similar to the principles in golf, it is important to pay close attention to your action. Since the ball leaves the paddle very quickly, I advise keeping your head aligned with the paddle until the moment of impact is nearly complete, then briefly looking up to observe where the ball lands. Avoid lifting

your head too early, as this may disrupt your focus. Our natural inclination toward achieving results suggests

that the longer we remain focused on our action, the more accurate our shot will be. This principle holds true not

only in pickleball but also in sports such as tennis, golf, and croquet!



SWING TIP

Lowering the Trajectory with Your Wedge



by Brad Pinho, Golf Teaching Professional & Club Fitter

For those advanced players looking to hit lower, more controlled wedge shots, this week's tip focuses on lowering the trajectory without sacrificing distance or speed. Typically, when trying to hit a lower ball flight, golfers opt to club up, allowing the lower loft of the next club to handle the distance. But this often requires slowing down your swing, which can affect feel and consistency. Here, we'll show you how to maintain a full-speed swing with your wedge while achieving a lower trajectory.

Warning: This tip may create a deep divot, so be sure to have sand on hand for repairs. Practice this on a turf mat before moving to grass to avoid damaging your practice area.

Step-by-Step Guide:

 Ball Position: Start by positioning the ball slightly behind your back foot or in line with your back foot. This setup helps you to



Focus on positioning the ball properly.

compress the ball properly and make solid contact.

- 2. Shift Your Weight: Move your head and body weight toward your lead side during set up (left for right-handed players). This will place more pressure on your front leg, which minimizes pressure on the back leg and helps prevent flipping the clubface at impact. The goal is to feel more stable and anchored on the lead side.
- 3. Swing with Speed & Control: As you swing, focus on accelerating through the ball with speed. The goal is to "stick the club in the dirt" meaning you want to take a clean divot after impact. Make sure to use the speed of your swing to drive the clubhead into



Shift your weight towards your lead side.

the ball, creating a lower, penetrating trajectory.

By properly pinching the ball, you'll not only achieve a lower launch angle but also give yourself the opportunity for great spin control, allowing the ball to stop quickly or even spin



Make sure to swing with speed and control.

back once it hits the green.

Pro Tip: The more speed you generate through the shot, the more spin you can potentially add. Just remember that the key to keeping the trajectory low is in your setup and your ability to stay aggressive through impact.

Terrific Trout Fishing

While last week in Key Largo the Reef Cup was getting all the attention of deep sea fishermen, a hardy band of Ocean Reef's trout-fishing devotees traveled to Argentina to fish the rivers coming out of the Andes. Thirteen anglers, including three father-son pairs, spent a week at the Patagonia River Ranch, an authentic and elegant lodge situated on the confluence of several key tributaries of the Collon Cura River.

The weather was good, the fish were plentiful, and this part of Argentina, on the eastern side of the Andes, is wide-open, untouched terrain; relatively accessible — the airport is a mere 30 minutes away — but teeming with wildlife. Rod **Patton** reports that there were condors in the air, a fishing eagle in a tree, mink on the banks and wild boars and red stag in the plains — and no competing anglers to be seen.

The ranch is on the Chimehuin River, a 600-acre estancia located within the much larger Tipiliuke estancia, and the lodge itself is a beautiful example of the stone and redwood style of architecture reminiscent of the Californian

who built it 50 years ago. Bill **Tweardy** admired the extensive gardens which produce all the herbs, fruit and vegetables for meals, but also 3,000 roses and other plantings, with a staff of five gardeners and two massive greenhouses to assist. One evening is an asado dinner, an Argentinian barbecue feast of grilled meats, sausage and offal, grilled over an open fire, here accompanied by musicians and dancers in native dress. The Argentinian wines, Malbec and Torontes, were wellrepresented.

Unlike the Reef Cup, this trout fishing is the opposite of competitive. The fishing is all catch and release, no comparisons of daily fish tally or size awards. Instead, the long days of sunlight are spent float fishing with nymphs or dry flies, mimicking the daily hatch. Mike Jones described the fish as relatively small, browns and rainbows in the

16 to 18 inch size, a few up to 20 inches, but strong fighters. When he goes back (and he will return!) he wants to bring his grandson, already a fishing fanatic, to have the experience here of unpressured fishing in the natural setting. Imagine

those days in the boat talking fishing and life in general, in this incomparable setting...

COAST GUARD AUXILIARY

Be Safe Out There

We are halfway through the season here at Ocean Reef, and near constant 15-knot winds have kept many of our boats at the dock awaiting nicer weather. However, balmy breezes will return in the coming months, and now is a good time to review your emergency gear and what procedures you should follow if the unexpected happens on the water.

On Thursday, March 13 I am teaching an Emergency Boating Course. This short course is a Coast Guard Auxiliary presentation that summarizes what you or your

spouse, crew or shipmate should do if you find yourself involved in an emergency situation at sea. I will show you what items to include in your "ditch bag" such as flares, strobes, knives, portable VHF radios etc.

The goal is to provide you with options. You are required by law to have basic emergency equipment. We'll go over those requirements and consider what extra items you might need based on where and how you boat. Daily trips to Gilberts call for different preparations than offshore fishing trips or crossing to the Bahamas!

I have been teaching this lecture for several years, and the classroom discussion always provides even the most seasoned boater a great review of safety procedures. Encourage your spouse, crew and boating friends to attend so that we can all be safe out on the water! Please join me at 3 p.m. in the Tarpon Room in Carysfort Hall on March 13.

'Live slow, sail fast!" by Neil Sullivan, CSSC Commodore

The fourth regatta Magic racing series delivered high winds, skillful sailing and a supportive cast of volunteers to post 11 races for 17 entries each Saturday in February. In order to score a cumulative multiple sailboat race, there are built-in equalizers similar to other sports to level the playing field. With sailboat scoring, once a threshold of a predetermined number of races takes place, the final score allows for "throw outs" of the worst races before tallying the final corrected score.

For example, this is not unlike the Reef Cup that gives extra points for catching a Sailfish on an outrigger (200 points) versus a kite-caught Sailfish which awards 100 points. Similarly golf has it's equalizers in that it takes into consideration one's handicap or whether applying a format such as Better Ball of partner's, Shamble or Modified Scotch. Regardless of the sport, the most skilled teams emerge victorious!

On Saturday, March 1, the top contenders realized there was much at stake in the fourth and final regatta of the Magic Series. It was still anyone's trophy to win. Pro Al Mast and his captain **Henry Stout** with their dedicated team of race committee and attendant boats, again surveyed the breeze and it wasn't pretty. The sailing instructions mandate an average wind speed of 5 knots and they could only find 3.8 knots at best. With anxious sailors holding port at Baker Harbor, 12 teams sat tight, hoping better news would follow. Pro Mast moved the committee boat around Pumpkin Cay testing various locations, but to no avail. The fourth and final race of the Magic Series had to be called off!

With this news, **Windsor Coffin**, the scoring wizard of
CSSC, went to work on the final
and definitive winners of the top
three boats. The calculations
included throwing out the three
worst scores of the 11 previous
races and totaling the remaining
eight scores of each boat.

The Results:

- 1st place: Jim Lampman and Jim Foster
- 2nd place: Gary Sayia and Nancy Lampman
- 3rd place: Joe and Alzbetka Robillard

Once again proving no matter the sport the best boats emerge victorious. As you read this article, the CSSC most prized award is up for grabs on **Saturday, March 8**. Come out for the twice around Pumpkin Cay race at 9:30 a.m. and watch the winner walk away with a piece of history created by our



BRIDGE TIP

Novice Corner

By Gregg Van Dyke, Bridge Director

Defense

- Defense is the most difficult part of Bridge.
- To win you must know defense.
- Review these rules before each match until you know them cold.

Opening Leads

- To Suit Contracts: You usually want to make a "safe" opening lead that will set up tricks fo your side without giving declarer extra tricks. Your general order of preference can be:
- A suit partner has bid. Lead low if you have 3+ cards; lead high from 2 cards.
- A suit that offers a good attacking combination - two or more touching honors (KQ10x, QJ10, AKxx, J109).
- 2. A singleton (hoping partner

- can lead the suit back for you to trump).
- 3. Your longest suit. Lead low if you don't have touching honors.
- 4. A suit the opponents have not bid
- If there are no unbid suits, choose a suit that dummy has bid.
- Lead trumps if you have no other safe lead OR if declarer has shown a two-suited hand. This may prevent declarer from using dummy's trumps separately.

When leading to a suit contract, Avoid:

- Leading an unsupported ace if you have another safe lead. (Aces are to catch kings).
- 2. Underleading an ace (don't lead a small card from a suit headed by the ace).
- 3. Underleading broken honor combinations (KJxx, 10x) unless it's in partner's suit.
- 4. Leading a suit declarer has bid (unless you're leading trumps).




