

Rock the Block Party

The neighborhood "Rock the Block" parties were initially introduced in 2022 as a way to celebrate Ocean Reef Club's 75/30 Anniversary and are returning again for the third year. If you haven't gotten started yet you can reach out to your Advisory Council representative. If you aren't sure who this is you can look at the listing on pages 16-17 of the 2025 ORCA Directory or the January 24, 2025 edition of the Ocean Reef Press.

In order for your neighborhood to come together and rock your block like it's the 1993 Member buyout, we have answers to the most frequently asked questions about this year's "Rock the Block" parties.

What is the date that the Club is hosting the "Rock the Block" parties? Can we do a different day? The Club's official date for the

block parties is **Tuesday**, **April**

22, the day before the End of Season Thank You Beach Party on **Wednesday**, **April 23**. However, each neighborhood has the option to select the date that works best for their residents (even if it is not April 22).

How long does the "Rock the Block" party have to be?

The timeframe is entirely up to each neighborhood to accommodate its residents.

What does the Club provide us with? Do we have to pay for anything?

The Club will provide all neighborhoods with tables, chairs, and linen at no cost.

Most neighborhoods choose to host their block party

potluck-style to provide the food and beverages. However, if desired, the Club can also provide catered food and beverages at a cost.

The Club offers three options:

- Option 1: The Club will provide tables and chairs at no cost. Your neighborhood will be responsible for all food and beverage.
- Option 2: The Club will provide tables and chairs at no cost. Your neighborhood may order food and/or beverages to be delivered by Catering (service not included).
- Option 3: The Club will provide tables and chairs at no cost. Your neighborhood may order catered food and/ or beverages with bartenders

and/or banquet servers included.

What do we do if our neighborhood does not have an Advisory Council representative?

For neighborhoods that do not have a Member representative on the Advisory Council, any Member (or group of Members) from the community can volunteer to head the planning effort.

Who do we contact for help with planning our "Rock the Block" party?

WHY I HATE RESPONDING TO **SURVEYS**

... and why I am making the Ocean Reef Membership Census an exception

Yep! In spite of my genuine dislike for filling out forms, I am now convinced that the Ocean Reef Membership Census, which will be in your email mailbox on February 12 (or a day or two after) is worth my time and trouble. Note: This is the second time I recently had to shed my strong convictions. The first was when I was beguiled by Daisy Mae, a cavapoochon, to abandon my lifelong position as "a non-dog person."

Do your duty....

For many of you, who enjoy puzzles and don't freeze (like

I do) when asked a direct question, checking all those boxes on the survey on what you like or don't like about Ocean Reef might be fun. For the rest of us, I now believe filling out that survey is an important obligation.

I have participated in enough discussions over a glass of wine at the Reef Lounge, or canasta at the Card & Games Room, or a hamburger lunch at the Raw Bar, etc. to know that many of you have specific complaints or high praise for the "goings on" at Ocean Reef. "But no one is listening!"

Well, what inspired my reaction to the Membership Census was that it might be one way we can be heard by the Board of Directors and the Management team that run the Club.

Board Chairman Charlie **Johnston** confirmed that opinion at the last Town Hall meeting when he said - "The Club's Census is probably the single most important strategic tool that the Board uses on an ongoing basis, setting the tone for what we need to do as a Club."

What to expect....

I won't lie to you; the questionnaire is long and a little complicated. But don't look at it as if you are taking the SAT's and the wrong answers might mean missing a shot at the college of your choice. You can skip questions or save your progress and take a break (although you can't change your answer, once you have entered it on your favored electronic device). And if you aren't sure of a date or number requested, just give an approximation or leave it blank.

Should you, for example, check "expensive" or "outdated" in a multiple-choice question on an overall opinion of the Club, be assured that the Club will never see your answer. All individual responses are anonymous.

How does it work

If you have an image of a lot of weary Ocean Reef employees counting and analyzing the Census surveys, not to worry. Although the Club Board and OR executives are involved in creating the questions, the responses are collected by an independent and highly qualified research firm that organizes the data and presents it to the Club for review. The aggregate of the anonymous responses gives the big picture of how the Ocean Reef Members perceive their Club and what direction they would like it to take in the future.

Signs of things to come

What will the ORC Census tell us about the present and the future of the Ocean Reef Club?

We will know the answer to that question, once all the information has been scanned and analyzed by the outside Census company. Then it will be turned over to the Board and the Club's President Alex Tonarelli, who will read it and discuss it, as if it were they were working for A's on their report card.

The three previous Census surveys (2010-2015-2020) proved to be a tremendous help in the decision-making of the volunteer Board of Directors and the experienced professional staff who run the Club.

In 2010 the focus on health brought us the Fitness Center; in 2015 the concern about parking resulted in the parking garage for associates; the importance of golf, as reflected in the Census, helped solidify the decision to build a new clubhouse in 2020.


Last Word

Protecting Your Pet: Navigating Canine Respiratory Infections

Although respiratory illness can occur anytime of the year in our pets, this is the season when canine respiratory infections tend to rise. These illnesses can spread quickly, especially in environments where dogs come into close contact, such as dog parks, boarding facilities, and grooming centers.

To help protect your furry companion:

1. Avoid high-risk areas where

- dogs congregate, particularly if your pet is elderly, very young, or has underlying health conditions.
- 2. Ensure your pet's vaccinations are current. While vaccines do not prevent all respiratory infections, they can reduce the severity and spread of certain illnesses.
- 3. Monitor your dog for coughing, nasal discharge, lethargy, or difficulty breathing. If your canine companion shows any of these signs, please keep them quarantined from other dogs and consult your veterinarian.

Protecting your companion and preventing the spread of infection starts by staying informed and vigilant.

Consult your veterinarian if you have any questions about keeping your pet healthy during this time of increased risk.

False Alarm Sparks Concern

During Radiological
Drill in Monroe County

On Tuesday, January 28, Monroe County Emergency Management conducted a routine radiological drill to assess response capabilities for potential incidents. However, an inadvertent mass message falsely declared an emergency at the Turkey Point Nuclear Plant, causing significant alarm among Ocean Reef residents due to the community's proximity to the facility.

Monroe County swiftly corrected the error with a secondary message clarifying that the initial alert was a false alarm. While the quick response helped alleviate concerns, the incident has prompted questions about communication protocols and measures to prevent similar occurrences.

As a critical element of emergency response, ORCA's

Public Safety Department has a specialized plan in place. Its Communications Center (Dispatch Room) features a dedicated direct line to Turkey Point Nuclear Plant for use during emergencies. In addition, the ORCA Member Directory (see pages 28-29) provides instructions for sheltering or evacuation when necessary.

To discuss these measures and address Member concerns, ORCA will host a Member Presentation to discuss its response plan in the event of a radiological emergency at Turkey Point. The forum will be held on **Wednesday**, **February 12** at 1 p.m. in the Ocean Reef Cultural Center, and will cover preparedness, address concerns, and offer a better understanding of the community's safety protocols. More details will follow soon.

ORCA and Monroe County remain committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of the community and will continue to work collaboratively to review and strengthen emergency protocols moving forward.



The Votes are in...

Of the many wonderful events that take place during All Charities weekend one of the Member's favorite is voting on what new wines will be featured property wide on all wine lists. As in year's past there were 10 white wines and 10 red wines to choose from. It was a wonderful turnout last Friday, keeping up with Ocean Reef traditions. So here are your 2025 All Charities Wines:

2022 Whitehall Lane Sauvignon Blanc, Napa Valley, California In 1993, the Leonardini Family purchased the Whitehall Lane Winery estate. They updated

the winemaking and barrel aging program and introduced a scientific approach in the vineyards. The winery now owns eight prime vineyard properties totaling more than 200 acres that are the cornerstone on which the wines are made. They include two vineyards in the St. Helena Appellation, three vineyards (including the winery) in the Rutherford Appellation, one vineyard in the Oak Knoll District of Napa Valley, one in Sonoma Valley and more recently a vineyard in the Petaluma Gap Appellation. All vineyards are farmed utilizing sustainable green practices to produce the finest grapes and all wine is made at the winery in St. Helena. The 2022 Sauvignon Blanc offers a great deal of complexity. On the nose, it evokes white peaches, golden delicious apples, sultanas, lemon zest and a hint of lemongrass. Though crisp up front, the mid-palate offers a mediumbodied texture. Its flavors include Gravenstein apples, Bartlett pears, yellow nectarines, baked apple crisp, brioche and a touch of marzipan. The finish has beautiful length with fresh acidity and subtle toasty notes.

2020 Smith & Hook Cabernet Sauvignon, Paso Robles, California

From its namesake vineyards, planted on former horse and cattle ranches near the rugged Pacific shoreline, Smith & Hook has been crafting robust wines for over 45 years. They work with small, like-minded growers in warmer areas along California's craggy coastline - in Arroyo Seco, Paso Robles, San Antonio Valley, Hames Valley and San Benito - to deliver a signature style of robust, richly layered wines. Fruit for this wine is sourced from Truesdale vineyard in Paso Robles. The well-drained arbuckle and sandy loam soils combined with the vineyard's deep inland location at 1,560 ft elevation and southfacing slope create the ideal terroir for intensely flavored


wines with depth of flavor, excellent structure and naturally balanced acidity. A deep purpleruby in the glass, this wine is fragrant and beautifully defined on the nose with aromas of macerated dark cherries, rich cassis, and candied violets which are further complexed with plum, dried herbs and cedar forest floor accents. The palate is vibrant, bursting with black and blue fruits, plum flavors, along with notes of warm fig and dark chocolate shavings. This wine is creamy textured, with seamlessly integrated fine tannins and brisk minerality that brings together all the layers in a long succulent finish.

These wines will be making their debut in all outlets in the next couple of weeks as we get new wine lists printed throughout property. As always, they will be in Port O' Call Wine and Spirits as well.

Lighthouses Described, Part II

From baby to youngster, I spent many hours happily listening in a warm crib or, later, my bed, to the two deep bass notes of the mighty foghorn associated with the lighthouse at the very tip of Michigan's little finger 13 miles away from me. The Grand Traverse Bay Lighthouse marked, in addition to the land itself, the start of a very dangerous area of wreck-strewn islands, shoals and reefs and lighthouses through which a large percentage of US freight passes as iron ore to steel mills near Chicago and heavy vessel traffic to and from Europe and Canada that is sent nautically into midwestern United states.

When rain, mist or fog would obliterate the light to less than 1000 yards, an iron ore carrier or most freighters needed to execute an emergency, almost impossible, 90 degree turn when depths decreased to avoid a grounding on the limestone rocky shoals that only a foghorn could have warned. This increased lighthouse utility identification via sound, but groundings still continued only partially abated.

At bicycle age, I could visit the lighthouse and pretend I was a favorite of the keeper who led me through his wellequipped family home on the first floor that had a wood stove galley, bedrooms and a cranked-to-call telephone as the only contact with the public world. The foghorn building had low-frequency marine radio communications with ships and a Coast Guard station in Green Bay, Wisconsin for weather forecasts. Best of all, we would climb the circular stairs that

I would count on the inside of the tower attached to his house up to the light tower top. The view was magnificent and stirring especially when a 1000 foot ore carrier would safely pass about a mile away.

The light and empty Coast Guard rescue station nearby are still in repair with furnishings including beds. The State of Michigan has made it a State Park including the foghorn building that is now the park museum where I still visit at least twice a summer with my guests. Thus, by creating a park, my lighthouse was saved from being sold. A local charity in my nearby village runs daily tourist tours to the park and into the lighthouse.

Those who wish to delve easier and further should google "Florida Keys lighthouses map" and then, open the "Florida map" and on that map, "visit". You should now have each of the lighthouses in Florida and can open each for history and photos. Click on "Carysfort" for the excellent, violent history and photos of our own lighthouse, visiting possibility, history and sale prices. Most Florida lighthouses are along Interstate 95 and 75 nearby shores including US 1 in the Keys.



I saw "Doubt" in 2005, when it first opened on Broadway and became that year's Tony Awards choice for "best play". I saw it again last year, when it had a highly praised Broadway revival. And now I am really excited about seeing it a third time on February 11 at the Ocean Reef Cultural Center, where I know the brilliant Zoetic Stage Company will do it justice.

During my 30-year stint as editor of "Playbill," I was required (not such a tough requirement) to see almost everything that opened on Broadway. "Doubt" bowled me over. It is right up there on my personal list of "best plays." I am so afraid that many OR Members might miss this fascinating theatrical experience that I can't help proselytizing. If you don't have a ticket, please buy one.

About – Doubt: A Parable:

Here's a rough summary: The play is set in the fictional Catholic school in the Bronx, during the fall of 1964. The school's principal, Sister Aloysius

is a rigidly conservative nun, who becomes convinced that a charismatic priest, Father Flynn, is developing an inappropriate relationship with a young male student. The upshot is a power struggle as Sister Aloysius tries to uncover the truth while grappling with the possibility that her doubts might be unfounded.

About - Zoetic Stage:

Zoetic Stage (whose home base is a small theatre, located in Miami's Adrienne Arsht Center) is, in a way, Ocean Reef's very own theatrical company. "Doubt: A Parable" is the eighth show that Zoetic has specially produced for a single night at Ocean Reef.

One night only is an awesome commitment. The sets and costumes, the lighting and sound must be designed or redesigned for the Cultural Center stage.

Fortunately for us, the two founders of Zoetic Stage, Stuart Meltzer and Michael McKeever, are up to the task. For the 15 years of the existence of Zoetic Stage, they have, not only selected and cast all of the frequently awardwinning Zoetic Stage productions, they have also often served as director (Stuart); actor, designer and sometimes writer (Michael).

NEWS FROM THE MEDICAL CENTER

February is Heart Month

February is recognized as National Heart Month, a good reminder for assessing what you do, or should do, to maintain heart health. Most are common sense, but there are other dietary considerations that are easy to ignore- like ultra-processed foods.

What is considered an ultraprocessed food and what exactly is the cause and effect on the human body? Various studies show consuming a diet high in ultra-processed foods (UPF) can result in direct links to a greater risk of heart disease-related deaths, type 2 diabetes, obesity, wheezing, anxiety, depression, sleep problems and *cognitive decline in middle-aged and older adults. UPFs are formulations of processed food substances (oils, fats, sugars, starch, and protein isolates) that contain little or no



whole foods and typically include flavorings, colorings, emulsifiers, preservatives and other cosmetic additives. Some prime examples are sweet and savory snacks, confectionery, breakfast cereals, ice cream, sugar-sweetened beverages, processed meats and ready-to-eat frozen meals.

The common-sense reminders:

 Chronic stress can negatively impact heart health. Techniques such as mindfulness, meditation, yoga and deep breathing exercises can help manage stress levels and promote relaxation.

- Routine health screenings and check-ups are vital for detecting and managing risk factors for heart disease.
 Regular monitoring of blood pressure, cholesterol levels and blood sugar can help identify potential issues early on.
- Regular exercise, a diet rich in vegetables, whole grains, healthy fats, lean proteins and low sodium. Avoid ultra-

processed foods as much as possible.





A spectacular array of colorful plants, flowers and butterflies delighted the members and guests of the Garden Group at Ocean Reef Monday on a field trip to Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden in Miami. Just an hour from ORC, a beautiful oasis awaits to dazzle visitors with its collection of over 30,000 plants representing more than 4,100 species. The garden gets its name from plant explorer Dr. David Fairchild, an educator and renowned scientist who was known for traveling the world in search of useful plants. He brought back hundreds of plants including mango, alfalfa, nectarines, dates, cotton, and flowering cherry trees.

A guided, 45-minute tram tour, led by a knowledgeable docent, provided members

with a relaxing, informative tour. Docent Suni shared many interesting horticultural facts including that Spanish moss is a miniature bromeliad. A highlight is the Wings of the Tropics exhibit, in the Clinton Family Conservatory, where visitors can see hundreds of magnificent butterflies year-round including a variety of the exotic genus Heliconius.

Members also wandered on their own through the rain forest, palm glade, and conservatory exhibits. Several Chihuly sculptures are displayed throughout the garden as well as 4000 orchids to color the landscape. The lovely Glasshouse Café serves breakfast and lunch and offers views of the butterfly conservatory.

All aspects of Fairchild enchanted the Garden Group and Vice-President **Penny Dinsmore** who encourages Ocean Reefers to plan a visit.

"It is a destination worth visiting many times, explained Dinsmore, "so that you can enjoy this fascinating botanical oasis in the different seasons."


different displays and explained why she loved particular styles and helped me understand why I loved the ones I did.

We couldn't make this kind



Photography as Public Art

In the early years of photography there were considerable discussions as to whether or not photography was art. But, much like paint, paper, clay and marble aren't art but rather the medium chosen by the artist to express his or her intentions, photography is the artist's tool. Today photography is considered to be one of the visual arts.

In the last article, we looked around Buccaneer Island and at the sculptures there. Heading away from the Inn and toward the Hibiscus, Frangipani and Poinciana meeting rooms we see something unique for public

art ... photographs out of doors. There are a total of seven stunning photographs of coral reefs on both sides of the building and in the adjoining grotto-like walkway. Walk into the meeting rooms and you'll find five more.

All 12 of them are by the prolific and renowned underwater photographer, Stephen Frink. He arrived to Key Largo in 1978 to open a small studio dedicated to underwater photo services, primarily renting cameras and processing E-6 slide film. He soon found himself on assignments to photograph and write articles for the consumer dive publications of the day. He currently is the publisher of "Alert Diver" Magazine, an upscale quarterly magazine for the members of the Divers Alert Network and owns WaterHouse Photo Tours dedicated to advanced underwater photo instruction and photo tours.

Wondering how his incredible photos hold up outside in our South Florida environment? The images are printed on aluminum using a dye sublimation process that infuses the image directly into the metal resulting in highdefinition details and colors that pop. In an interview with Florida Keys News, he said, "I've always wanted my underwater photography to inspire an appreciation of the coral reef. We protect what we love. I hope my images might educate and inspire." They do.

Walk across the street to Carysfort Hall where you'll find another eight of Frink's incredible photographs that give those of us who don't scuba or snorkel the





opportunity to see the beauty of the reefs up close and personal.

You'll also find four photographs by Alan S. Maltz at Carysfort Hall. His nature, destination and landscape photography has led to his designation as the Official Wildlife Photographer of Florida by the Wildlife Foundation of Florida and as Visit Florida's Official Fine Art Photographer of Florida. Florida has been the

heart of his artistic career for nearly four decades. His gallery, the Alan S. Maltz Gallery, in Old Town Key West just celebrated its 26th anniversary in January.

The photographs of these two master photographers not only evoke emotion but also raise awareness about important community issues such as environmental stewardship. Take the time to see them and be inspired.

Steak Burrito Bowl **Yields 4 Servings**

A nice and fast recipe for a Sunday football, you can marinate the meat in advance, get all your prep ready and just build the bowls last minute. Everyone will love it!

Ingredients:

- 20 oz skirt steak
- 1 tbsp garlic, minced
- 1/4 cup soy sauce
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1/4 tsp cumin
- 2 tbsp parsley, chopped
- 2 tbsp lime juice

- 2 cups white rice, cooked
- 2 cups romaine lettuce, chopped
- 2 roma tomatoes, medium diced
- 2 cups pinto beans, cooked
- 1 cup cheddar cheese, shredded
- 1/2 cup cilantro, chopped
- 1 lime, cut in 4 wedges
- Garnishes: Guacamole, sour cream, jalapeno, tortillas chips, red onion, cilantro (optional)

Directions:

- In a mixing bowl, combine garlic, soy sauce, olive oil, cumin, parsley and lime juice.
- Whisk until all ingredients are incorporated. Add the meat to the marinate rubbing all sides.
- Cover and refrigerate for at least one hour (it tastes better the longer it marinates).
- Remove steak from the marinade and pan sear over medium heat until it is

Storm Spotting & Tropical Cyclones in the Keys

National Weather Service Meteorologist, Jon Rizzo, Brings Weather Wisdom to Ocean Reef

Many of us are fascinated by weather events, especially the extreme storms that sometimes affect our area. The Coast Guard Auxiliary is sponsoring two rare opportunities to learn more about local Keys weather and extreme weather events.

On Thursday, February 13, we will host Jon Rizzo, a senior National Weather Service (NWS) meteorologist based in Key West. Jon has led the weather decision support and preparedness programs for the NWS Forecast Office in the Florida Keys since 2002. He is the primary deployment-ready meteorologist serving Monroe County during tropical storm and hurricane events. He is also an engaging speaker.

Jon will give two lively presentations at the Key Largo Building (across from Carysfort), the first from 2-3:30 p.m. on the SKYWARN program, and the second from 4-5 p.m. on Keys weather and hurricanes.

SKYWARN Storm and Marine Spotter Training:

The National Weather Service established the SKYWARN Storm Spotter Program in the 1970s to help obtain critical "ground truth" observations during severe thunderstorm and tornadic events. In conjunction with improved NOAA satellite and Doppler radar data, SKYWARN spotters enable the NWS to issue more timely and accurate alerts.

Relying on close to 400,000 trained volunteers nationally, SKYWARN reports to the NWS provide the critical gift of time: minutes that save lives. You can

become a forward observer to help protect your community in times of severe weather.

To further the SKYWARN program, participants will learn to keep an eye on the sky. Observe visual clues that identify severe weather, recognize false "look-alike" cloud formations, and report live-time findings. Jon will

include information on severe storms at sea, hazardous wind and sea conditions, and weather avoidance – components critical to many in our community.

Keys Weather Session:

The second presentation will address tropical cyclones in the Florida Keys, including climatology and rapid storm intensification. Understand how the Florida Keys National Weather Service provides tropical cyclone threat assessments to local, state, and federal emergency management bodies.

Jon will discuss how to access and interpret official NWS information on hurricanes and tropical storm threats to our region, and how local NWS services have evolved with the new Monroe County Emergency Operations Center.



Adventures in Indonesia

I spent a month fishing in Indonesia. Our group of six, which included Steve Yatomi of Adventure Travel Alliance, first met in Jakarta. From there, our first destination was West Papua, New Guinea. We flew into Nabire, and from there took a two-and-a-half-hour

van ride to Masipawa and then a 45 minute boat ride to our destination. We lived with a family of fishermen for the next week. They had an extra building with two bedrooms that had two twin beds in each. No running water. Shower (no hot water) and restroom were in a separate building about 40 yards away. In there was a large trough, with a pipe that ran water constantly into it. It had a small bucket with a handle that you poured over yourself for

We fished for a variety of species over the next six days which included, giant trevally, speckled grouper, big eye tarpon, whitetip shark and of course the famed New Guinea bass, of which four were boated while we were there. The best area took us up a small river where we encountered a large colony of giant fruit bats. We took a chainsaw to cut away log jams to the area for New Guinea Bass, where we boated two.

This area was truly off the grid, as we were the first Caucasian people to visit in four years.

The chief of police fished with us one day. Being the chief, he was the only resident to carry a rifle. There was a sandy point ahead, and a nice six-foot croc met his end, as the chief took dead aim.

I stayed up that night as the two locals carefully skinned the croc. We ate the meat for the next two days and the skin was sold in town.

SWING TIP

Mastering Sloping Lies – Ball Above Your Feet

When you find the ball above your feet on a sloping lie, it presents unique challenges that can affect both your alignment and your shot. Here's how you can adjust to make sure you're hitting solid, accurate shots in these situations.

1. Choke Down on the Club

The first adjustment to make is to choke down on the grip of your club. Since the ball is positioned higher than usual, it will be closer to you in the setup. By shortening the grip, you ensure you can maintain the proper distance from the ball and make more solid contact. Choking down allows for a more comfortable, controlled swing that ensures the clubface strikes the ball cleanly.

2. Club Resting Lower – Loft is Pointed Left

With the ball above your feet, the club will naturally rest lower at setup. This can cause the loft to be pointed more to the left (for right-handed golfers), which typically leads to a pull or a hook if you're not careful. To compensate for this, you'll need to adjust the face of the club. Simply open the clubface by rotating the grip slightly. This adjustment will counteract the leftward bias and allow you to straighten out the ball flight.

Bonus tip: The more you are using the loft on the club the more you need to open the face.

3. Adjust Ball Position – Slightly Back in Your Stance

In sloping lies, your swing arc will change slightly. Since the ball is now raised and closer to your body, it's essential to shift the ball position slightly back in your stance. By doing this, you'll ensure that the club makes contact with the ball at the right moment in your swing, before it hits the ground too early in the arc. This will give you a more solid strike and help you avoid digging into the turf too early.

Sloping lies with the ball above your feet can be tricky, but with the right adjustments, you can easily navigate these situations. Remember to choke down, open the clubface, and adjust ball position. These set up adjustments apply for any type of golf shot when the ball is positioned above your feet. Give this a try next time you are practicing at our short game area around the rough or even in the bunkers.



What Everyone Needs to Know for a Healthy Heart

(Including What to Ask of Your Doctor)

The heart and its vessels are our body's delivery system, bringing oxygen and nutrients in and delivering waste to the proper places for disposal. This delivery system is literally your lifeline, and its efficacy translates into every single cell in your body. Heart disease doesn't start when you get diagnosed with a blockage or have a heart attack; it starts years, perhaps decades earlier. Taking care of your heart and its vessels is a long game- it means embracing a lifestyle, not just a pill or a procedure.

The undisputed fact that heart disease is (for most people) preventable is perhaps an inconvenient truth. This means that you're actually in the driver's seat with every lifestyle decision you make. The four lifestyle factors (choices) that have the biggest impact on preventing heart disease are: 1) not smoking; 2) 30 minutes of exercise daily; 3) not being obese; and 4) eating well (defined as: abundant fruits and veggies, whole grains, and low animal product consumption). Appropriate testing includes monitoring blood pressure and blood sugar as well as blood lipoproteins (especially APO B, LP PLA2) and if you don't know your APO E status, it's time to get it tested, as it has an impact on how aggressive to be to keep those cholesterol levels in check. 



TENNIS TIP

Prepare, then Move



'Tennis Tip" by Alex Henderson, Assistant Tennis Professional

One of the key fundamentals in tennis is preparing your racket before moving to the ball. If you run first and prepare later, you'll constantly be late, off-balance, and forced into rushed swings. Instead, as soon as you recognize where the ball is going, start your

preparation immediately.

Begin with a full shoulder turn, bringing your racket back early. This isn't just about arm movement—the shoulder turn engages your core and legs, giving you better stability and power. Your non-dominant hand should help guide the racket back while your dominant hand stays relaxed. By the time you move your feet, your racket is already set, and all that's left is to swing through the ball.

Early preparation leads to cleaner, more controlled shots, allowing you to dictate play instead of scrambling to keep up. Prepare first, move second, and watch your game improve.



When the **Bidding Goes:**

1 Club — pass — pass — ?

By Gregg Van Dyke, Bridge Director

When a 1 club opening bid is passed to you, keep in mind your partner was not strong enough to overcall 1 club.

When a 1 club opening bid is passed to you, look at your club length. If you are short, your partner may yet have a good hand. If you have club length,

there is a good chance your partner is weak.

- 1. S- Q4 H- 876 D- KJ76 C-AJ95
- 2. S- Q98 H-A954 D-KJ87

With (1) pass because partner is probably short in clubs and probably weak not to be able to bid at the one level. The opener probably has the 18- 19 point balanced hand and wants to get back into the bidding.

With (2) double your club shortness indicates that partner may have a good hand with clubs after all.




