

Gotta Question?

Do the Mokes I see around The Reef have to abide by the rules for cars or golf carts?

Great question, the answer is cars!

Mokes are classified as Low-Speed Vehicles (LSV) and can be driven legally on all roads with a speed limit of 35 MPH or less, which is compatible with Ocean Reef's speed limits of 5, 15, or 25 MPH. ORCA rules state that Mokes may only be driven on roads, not on golf cart lanes. Mokes are also not allowed on golf courses. They must be parked in regular motor vehicle parking spots, not spaces designated for carts.



In comparison to golf carts, Mokes are bigger therefore incompatible with our golf cart parking spots at Ocean Reef. As they can be driven on Ocean Reef's main roadways, drive your Moke with the same caution and adherence to rules as you would any motor vehicle.

ORC Legend **Bob Toski** Recognized by Florida Panthers "Heroes Among Us" Program

Growing up in Indiana during the '60s, I remember having lots of heroes. Most of my book reports in elementary school were about our founding fathers or other great Americans like Clara Barton, George Washington Carver, or Thomas Edison. Today, it seems, heroes are harder to find since no human flaw escapes the 21st century media. As such, it was encouraging to find that the Florida Panthers, 2024 Stanley Cup Champions, still believe in heroes and honor them at their games. The "Heroes Among Us" program, initiated by the Florida Panthers' Foundation, gives the South Florida community the opportunity to nominate and honor veterans or those currently serving in any branch of the US military. All of those chosen for this honor are recognized at Panthers' home hockey games. Recently, at the first game of the Stanley Cup Finals June 8th, ORC legend and its first Director of Golf, Bob Toski, received this distinction for his military service and contributions to the game of golf.

Toski was drafted after high school at age 18 and went to India and then Burma as a tech sergeant in the Infantry. In a 2018 interview for the series, "Veteran's Chronicles," an American Veterans Center program where vets tell their story in their own words, Toski

explained, "After I saw what happened at Pearl Harbor, I couldn't wait to serve. I became a patriot." An expert rifle marksman, he was days from beginning jungle warfare in Burma when the atomic bomb ended the war. "I was prepared to die for my country." The contrast between the stark poverty of life in India and the loss of so many American lives made him appreciate the US even more, he stated. Although Toski was spared facing combat in the jungle. he believes, "That (military) preparation matured me and made me a better teacher and player in my golf career." He believes the excellent eye-hand coordination that made him an expert marksman is also what made him an expert at golf. He appreciates his military experience and its positive impact on his life, but admits, "I detest war. I feel so bad about all the guys that lost their lives. But once you're a soldier, you're always a soldier. It stays strong within your heart. You need to remember those who didn't come back."

In addition to his tenure at Ocean Reef from 1960-1972. 97-year-old Toski was the leading money winner on the tour in 1954, where he earned \$65,819. He left the tour at age thirty to spend more time with his wife and three young children and focused his career on teaching. He started the Golf Digest instructional schools in 1971 with Jim Flick and was a pioneer in video instruction. Toski was the first living instructor inducted into

the Golf Teachers Hall of Fame in 1990 and joined the ranks of the PGA Golf Professional Hall of Fame in 2013. Judy Rankin, a legend in her own right in the LPGA and golf's first female broadcaster, is one of Toski's many success stories, serving as his assistant at Ocean Reef for several winters while also playing together five times a week.

Much is celebrated at Ocean Reef surrounding Bob Toski and his legendary golf career, and now gratitude for his service to our country is a part of that story.

La Colombe, we're so perked up, we imagine handpicking these blended beans in Brazil, Colombia and Honduras.

Midday in Latin America, Asia, and the Caribbean

Palm Court: For a break from the heat, we head to Palm Court indoors at The Islander. The team here has taken food travel to the next level with a host of new items, including Mediterranean Mezze (hummus), a Tex-Mex Rice Bowl, Peruvian and Mexican Ceviche, Sake served by carafe, Enchilado de Camarones (shrimp Creole), Grilled Churrasco with Yuca Fries or Tostones (fried green plantains), rice, beans, and black beans. The summer sushi menu has new lunch roll standouts such as the Acevichado (shrimp tempura, avocado, lime aioli, crispy sweet potatoes, lime aioli)

and extended nigiri and sashimi options. Para postre (for dessert), try the Tres Leches.

The Beach Grill: Not wanting to be weighed down by a big midday meal, the next day we try the newest nibbles on the Beach Grill lunch menu. The Tuna Tostada, Floribbean Conch Salad, and a Vietnamese Rice Paper Roll, keep it light poolside. Those opting for heartier chow before their lounge chair siesta, choose the new tasty toasty Cuban sandwich, made with layers of pork, ham, and melted Swiss fresh off the new sandwich press. ¡Qué delicioso!

(Mostly) American Red, White, and Blue

The Grill Room: Drawn to the fresh smells of home broths (a friend claims she can drink the tomato soup by the gallon), they keep us coming by for that cozy feeling on a rainy day. Seinfeld devotees can rejoice- there is soup for you from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Sunday through Thursday. A return trip for Steakhouse

Nights from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. gives our meat lovers a reason to celebrate. Don't think CH Prime, this is a fresh new take on weekend steak dinners. Filet Mignon, New York Strip and for fish lovers, there's Crispy Salmon.

Toski's: Al fresco dining in the summer is possible with the shaded covered outdoor patio with large ceiling fans at Toski's. With the Reef Hut currently closed, they've added more favorites to the menu. We're talking hot honey ham and Italian sandwiches and chipotle turkey melts. The best part is we can lunch here daily until 4 p.m.

Burgee Bar: Nothing shouts the USA louder than our favorite on-site American gastro pub. Head for the San Francisco Crunch Salad (we like ours finely chopped), the California club, The Texas Brisket End Melt, or the Florida Snapper Wrap. Our travel tip here is to save room for the Chocolate Chip Cookie Cobbler and Key Lime Pie made in house.

Raw Bar: Every good trip needs a reliable stop and Raw Bar is that one for us. Not any summer menu changes and that's fine by us. Crab cakes please!

The Islander: Chef Eric

has added five new rolls named after the Members who inspired them, along with new Wahoo Dynamite and Ninja Rolls. Also new for summer is (angry) Crispy Calamari and Mussels Marinere appetizers, Watermelon Salad, Mahi Rueben, Citrus Sangra Salad, Hibachi Steak, Yaki Udon Noodles, and Roasted Peruvian Chicken. Wonder if collared kimonos would pass the ORC dress code.

Gianni: Chef Ryan explores the varying regional tastes of Italy with summer weekend menu specials, featuring inspirations from Florence, the Amalfi Coast, Bologna, Tuscany and more. 

Essential Boating Tips for a Safe 4th of July & 2024 Lobster Season

As the month of July approaches, excitement is in the air at Ocean Reef. The surrounding vibrant marine life and beautiful coral reefs are expected to lure 4th of July revelers once again and-later in the month-lobster enthusiasts. "There are more people boating in our area because of our natural resources," said Pete Liashek, Flotilla Public Education Officer, USCG Auxiliary, Ocean Reef Flotilla. "Everyone is here to visit our greatest natural wonder, the coral reef."

Florida's 2024 lobster sport

season, locally dubbed the "mini-season," runs from July 24 through July 25, allowing lobster hunters a short but intense window to capture the prized crustaceans. For the first time this year, Floridians will have an exclusive day of lobster hunting on Sunday, July 14, before tourists and commercial fishermen can participate. Following the mini-season, the regular lobster season begins at 12:01 a.m. on August 6, 2024, and continues through midnight on March 31, 2025.

Boating Safety Tips During High Traffic

Monroe County has the highest rate of boating accidents in Florida, with the epicenter being the waters stretching from Elliot Key to Islamorada. This area includes the waters surrounding Ocean Reef and North Key Largo, making safety a top priority during the busy lobster season. Statistics show

that 82 percent of boating accidents involve operators who have not taken a formal boating course. The Florida state boating course, available online at MyFWC.com/boating.

Essential Safety Checklist

With the increase in boating traffic for the month, please follow Liashek's boating safety reminders:

Lookout: "The number one reason for accidents is not having a lookout," he says. "Have someone watching the water with you to alert you to boat traffic in your area."

Maintain Situational

Awareness: Be aware of what's going on around you and in your boat. This includes monitoring other boats, swimmers, and obstacles.

Safety Equipment

Knowledge: Ensure your guests know the location of safety equipment such as life jackets, flares, and fire extinguishers.

Life Jackets: Verify that you have one life jacket for each person on board and ensure they are the correct size. "The standard 'red' life jacket is not

the appropriate size for a child," says Liashek.

Provisions: Make sure you have enough water and food for all your crew. People get dehydrated faster on the water due to the sun and lack of shade, especially since the water temperature is around 84 degrees.

Boating Card Requirement:

Any boater born after January 1, 1988, must have a Florida state boating card in his/her possession to operate a boat in Florida waters. Boating insurance premiums are reduced for those who have boating certificates from a course, so getting certified also offers financial benefits. Visit MyFWC.com/boating for more information.

By following these safety tips and adhering to regulations, everyone can have a memorable 4th of July holiday and safe lobster season.

The easiest way to register to vote by mail is to fill out the online form on the Monroe County Elections page. The following are some important dates to remember:

Primary Election 2024: August 20, 2024

July 22, 2024- Deadline to

register to vote or change party affiliations

August 8, 2024- Deadline to request that ballot be mailed

August 5-17, 2024- Early voting period

General Election 2024: November 5, 2024

October 7, 2024- Deadline to register to vote (no deadline to change party affiliation)

October 24, 2024 – Deadline to request that ballot be mailed

October 21, 2024- November 2, 2024-Early voting period

Driving a Golf Cart

A fun aspect of life here at Ocean Reef is being able to travel by golf cart, and for children and grandchildren, getting a cart license is a rite of passage. But there are rules surrounding who, where, when and how they can be driven so I sought an overview of common issues everyone should know according to Ariel Artime, Vice President/Director of Public Safety and Operations for ORCA (Ocean Reef Community Association).

Who can drive a golf cart?

All Members and Guests over 16 with a valid state issued driver's license may drive a cart.

Do licensed Minors (ages 16 and 17) have limitations on when they may drive?

Yes. They must carry their license at all times. Those 16 years old may not drive after 11pm and those 17 years old may not drive after 1am unless with a licensed driver over the age of 21.

Does ORCA issue Learner's Permits?

Yes, with the following regulations:

Child must be at least 4ft

- 9in tall and at least 10 years old
- Must pass a written test
- Must be accompanied by a licensed driver at least 18 years old
- May only drive a slow cart (under 17 mph)
- May only drive during daylight hours
- Must wear provided yellow lanyard at all times while driving
- Parent or guardian must sign an indemnity agreement

What are the rules for driving with an ORCA issued license?

- Must be at least 12 years old and have held a Permit for over one year
- Must pass a driving test given by a trained Public Safety Officer
- Must wear provided blue lanyard at all times while driving

Who do you call to arrange for a Learner's Permit or Driving Test this Summer?

To make appointments, contact ORCA Members Services, 9am to 4pm, 305 367-7343.

Can children ride in laps of adults?

Children should not be held on a lap especially by the driver. It is suggested that all carts have seatbelts for children and infants ride in a car seat. Cart Rentals (305-367-6520) can install seatbelts within a few hours. Amazon can deliver a suitable car seat within a day or two. Note: All Ocean Reef Club rental carts are equipped with seatbelts.

A few quick tips for cart drivers:

- Always check if those facing backward are safely seated and warn your passengers when you are making any sharp turns. Turns are the greatest cause of accidents by either a rollover or ejection.
- Obey all traffic signs similar to your vehicle which includes no texting and observing a oneway street.



includes no texting and observing a one-like this one-way street sign at the Fishing Village.

- Do not exceed capacity. Most carts are four-passenger and some are designed with six seats.
- Bellstand is available until 1am if a cart driver feels unable to safely drive their cart.
- Carts must merge into the car lane before making a left turn and use the cart lane when making a right turn.
- No driving in parks, on beach or on golf courses.



COLLARED SHIRTS





PANTS



For golf, you will need long pants or walking length shorts. And don't dream of wearing your cargo pants on the course.

SWIMSUIT #1



The Ocean Reef Dress Code states that Thong style swimsuits are prohibited. Be aware that by ignoring this rule, not only will you be offending your fellow OR members but you will be asked to leave Buccaneer.

HATS



At ORC we are into "decapitation". So remove your cap when you enter a restaurant or other OR facility. (Exceptions – Raw Bar, Burgee Bar, Grill Room for lunch and Fitness Centers.) Don't ever wear your golf cap backwards.

SHORT SHORT SHORTS



Even if you are young and beautiful, don't wear your Short, Short Shorts that don't cover anywhere on The Reef.

SWIMSUIT #2



The attractive pink Swimsuit #2 is acceptable under the Dress Code, since (unlike Swimsuit #1) the bikini bottom provides "appropriate coverage."

SLEEVELESS SHIRTS AND TANKS



Sleeveless tops are fine for jogging or for Buccaneer Island. But make sure they are manufactured for athletic wear. If a shirt looks like an undershirt or has some dopey saying on it, then it's a NO NO at ORC.

JEANS



According to the Dress Code, short or long jeans are OK, but please only nice classics. No cut-offs, cutouts, rips or tatters.

COVER-UPS



When is a cover-up a good thing? The Dress Code requires Bathing Suit Cover-ups, as well as footwear, be worn in all areas away from Buccaneer Island's beach and pools.



We Mourn the Loss

Harold "Spike" Yoh

Rare is the person who both commands the entire room and makes you feel like you're the only one in it. Spike Yoh was such a man. Larger than life, he had an enormous impact on myriad organizations and communities, yet perhaps the most common observation from others is how focused Spike was on them as individuals. Whether a colleague, an employee, a young person, or a worker in a local boutique or supermarket, Spike made others feel special. This was his superpower. And with all of this, nothing was more important to him than family, friends, and faith. Harold L. "Spike" Yoh, Jr., 87, went home to the Lord on Friday, June 21, 2024 surrounded by loved ones. His beautiful and peaceful passing concluded several years of on-and-off



health challenges which culminated in renal failure and congestive heart failure. Affable and magnanimous to the end, Spike received visitors, phone calls, Zooms, and FaceTimes until just hours before he passed. Spike was born in Bryn Mawr, Pennsylvania, in 1936 on December 12, a birthday he shared with his favorite crooner, Frank Sinatra. He graduated from The Haverford School and then, in 1958, from Duke University, where he met (the first) love of his life, Mary

an MBA from The Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania. Spike and Mary were married in 1959 and remained loyal companions until Mary's death in 2015 after a long illness. Spike and Mary had five children, and they developed a parenting philosophy intended to build a cohesive yet diverse group. All seven family members (plus several other relatives) attended Duke, and at one point, all five children worked in the family business. Spike Yoh was an incredibly successful business and civic leader. In the mid-1970s, after having to outbid two public companies to buy his father's business, Day & Zimmermann, Spike led D&Z through a period of meteoric growth. When he retired in 1999, the company had 16,000 employees and was one of the largest privately held businesses in the US. Spike's volunteer career spanned an even longer timeframe than his professional endeavors. He filled the role of chairman or other leadership positions in organizations such as National Defense Industrial Association, National Technical Services Association, Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce, Boy Scouts of America, United States Olympic Committee, and The Haverford School. The two-part culmination of his community leadership efforts was as board chair for Duke University and then Ocean Reef Club. Never one to maintain the status quo, Spike had the uncommon ability to diagnose what ailed a community and the vision and wherewithal to develop a strategy and roadmap to enroll broad swaths of stakeholders as active participants in moving toward a better future. Mary, an active community volunteer as well, was his partner and biggest supporter throughout his business and volunteer activities. As a couple, they engendered tremendous loyalty and love from anyone who worked for or with them. Spike considered his Young Presidents Organization "Forum," a small group of fellow business

(nee Milus). He also earned

leaders and family men with whom he met regularly for more than thirty-five years, as the "board of directors of his life." Spike valued friendship as much as anyone could. His infectious personality, zeal for living, and flat-out love of a good time created deep bonds and indelible memories for countless people fortunate enough to call him a friend. No group better exemplified these bonds than his beloved "Ollie Brothers," five fraternity brothers from Duke who remained close for the rest of their lives, routinely gathering for Duke Basketball games and with their spouses and growing families for reunions. Spike fell in love for the second time during the pandemic and, in May 2021, married Gail McConnell. also a widow. The Yohs and McConnells had been close friends for forty-five years, since their sons, also lifelong friends, met in kindergarten. Providentially, Spike and Gail gave the eulogy at each other's first spouse's funeral. They grew together in their faith during their brief but terrific three-year marriage. Spike was predeceased by his first wife, Mary, their daughter, Karen (d. 2007), and his half-siblings Robert Yoh and Marianne Yancey. He is survived by his wife, Gail, his sons Hal (Sharon), Mike (Gayle), Jeff (Suzanne), and Bill (Kelly), plus fourteen grandchildren, four grandchildren-in-law, and five great grandchildren. He is also survived by his sister, Barbara Juda, his half-brother, Ted, his stepson, Stephen McConnell (Mandy), stepdaughter Stephanie Moleski (Charlie), and four stepgrandsons. Services were held on Thursday. June 27 in Bryn Mawr, PA. Consistent with Spike's focus on others, please consider making a donation in his honor to the charity of your choice.

"If We Can Keep It: The Forgotten Promise of American Liberty"

As Americans, we are looking forward to the celebration of our independence on the fourth of July this year. Festivities and fireworks will take place in every small town and major city across our land. Ocean Reef Club will be no exception!

However, the milieu, the context in which our celebration takes place this year is one of civil strife and bitter political division. It is a moment of great concern as we observe the 248th anniversary of our nation's founding.

As I was preparing to write this week, Eric Metaxas' important book titled, "If We Can Keep It: The Forgotten Promise of American Liberty" came to mind. He titled the introduction, "The Promise."

The following is my summary of his words. It is a sobering reminder of what is required from each of us if we are to maintain the gift of our liberty.

For 100 days in the summer of 1787, a gathering of some of the most brilliant minds of that generation met in Independence Hall. They were creating the legal foundations for a form of government that had never been tried before. They were creating the possibility of something called the United States of America.

Dr. James McHenry wrote an account of Benjamin Franklin's meeting with a Mrs. Powell during those days. "Well doctor," she asked him, "what have we got? A republic or a

monarchy?" Franklin, who was rarely short of words or wit, shot back, "A republic, madam, if you can keep it."

What Franklin meant was that whatever document they ended up with, and whatever

government it described and created, could only be a beginning. The people themselves would have to do a lot to make it work.

The Constitution they created was a pointer to something beyond itself, a promise...one that could be broken or kept by the people to whom it was entrusted.

The Constitution was a ship of state the founders launched onto history's ocean, the likes of which had never been seen before. What they created that summer has so grown and flourished in the more than two centuries following that it is simply without equal.

However, at that moment in 1787, it still only pointed toward the future, like an arrow in a cocked bow. It held great promise because it was a promise to every American, present and future. It constituted a promissory note to which every American was full heir.

This then was the gamble of the founders – one that placed tremendous trust in the people to whom they bequeathed this fragile form of government.

We need to be reminded that it is a promise that must keep on being fulfilled. And we are the ones who must fulfill it. But what is required of us to keep that promise and to continue to fulfill it?

What is required of us, of each of us who are "we the people," is something we have mostly forgotten. The main point is that each of us who call ourselves Americans has a great duty to keep that promise - and if we don't do our duty toward keeping that promise, our nation will soon cease to exist in any real sense.

It is not enough for us merely to exist as a people, doing the minimum of simply obeying our laws and minding our own business. More is required of Americans if America is truly to be America. The founders understood that America would not flourish without great help from all Americans.

The ordered liberties and how they were to work together required a citizenry devoted to keeping them in order, so we were all in it together. The possibility of our continuing to keep that promise would vanish if we failed to take our duties seriously.

The idea that our government is "we the people" is not a corny idea that doesn't mean much. It is in fact an idea of great genius and is the main operating principle by which this nation has stayed alive and has expanded its freedoms for over two centuries.

But once "we the people" begin to forget that, and cease to do what is necessary as Americans, it all begins to fall apart.

We are in desperate, indeed urgent, need of a primer on these vital things. To cease doing what is necessary along these lines is to cease existing. But we are in very real danger of doing just that, of becoming America in name only.

The promise of the Constitution has been kept to the extent that so much has been done thus far. But much more must be kept now and tomorrow, by you and by me.

We are ourselves this moment the keepers of the flame of liberty. We are the ones charged by Franklin and the other founders and by history, past, present, and future with the keeping of this grand promise to the world. If the flame given to us goes out, we not only lose the light ourselves forever but will also lose the ability to pass it on to others who are waiting for it.

Introducing Recipes from Chef Betania's Kitchen:

Easy Bhuna Shrimp



by Betania Salles, Carysfort Kitchen Chef de Cuisine

Prior to coming to Ocean Reef Club, I was the Head Chef of Imlee Indian Bistro. While there I was able to fully embrace Indian curries and spices and share the aromatic adventure with our guests. The element of surprise and explosion of flavors that can be experienced when enjoying Indian Cuisine is what has always drawn me to it. I know it might seem intimidating because of this, but there are recipes, like this Bhuna Shrimp that are really quite easy. You don't need to be a cook to prepare it!

Easy Bhuna Shrimp

Bhuna curries are originated in Bangel, India.

Serves 2

Ingredients:

14oz large shrimp, 13/15 size, peeled and deveined 3 tbsp grapeseed or avocado oil

1 tbsp garlic, finely chopped 1 tbsp ginger, finely chopped 1 cup Vidalia onions, small diced

1/2 cup green peppers, seeded, small diced

1 green chili or half a jalapeno, thinly sliced

1/2 tsp turmeric

1/2 tsp cumin powder

1/2 tsp coriander powder

1/2 tsp Garam masala*

1/4 tsp chili powder or cayenne pepper

1 tbsp tomato paste

1 1/2 cups ripe tomatoes, small diced

1/2 tsp salt

1/2 tbsp lime juice

1/3 cup water

1/3 cup fresh cilantro, roughly chopped

Directions:

In a large sauté pan, drizzle 3 tbsp of oil, add garlic, ginger and onions, cook for 2 minutes, at medium-high heat until soft. Next, add green peppers, the green chili or jalapenos. sauté for 45 seconds. Add all the dry spices and stir well, then add tomato paste and sauté until well incorporated. Now, add tomatoes, salt and water, stir and let it cook for about 3 minutes or until sauce is thick. Then add the king prawns and lime juice, cook for about 1 1/2 to 2 minutes, until shrimp is fully cooked but still tender.

Turn off the heat, sprinkle fresh cilantro. Than serve it immediately with white rice or naan.

*While you can use store-bought, I like to make my own. Here is the recipe should you want to prepare yourself:

GARAM MASALA

1/2 cup Cumin Seeds

2 tbsp Coriander seeds

6 each Black Cardamom

3 each Cinnamon sticks, broke into medium pieces

8 each Dry Bay leaves

10 whole Cloves

Toast everything in a sauté pan or oven for couple minutes. Cool it down and grind it to powder in a seed/coffee grinder.



Through fortune, foresight, and fortitude, Larry positioned himself into what proved to be a highly entertaining and





Did you ever think you'd be here – no, here - on the third largest barrier reef in the world (behind Great Barrier of Australia and the Belize Barrier)? and star corals. Other smaller corals filled. They had a fine time. Unlike like tree forests where limbs and leaves die off and rot, coral limbs don't decay - they accumulate on the sea floor. New coral builds on top of the old. So higher and higher the sea floor rises - underwater all the while. Oops, the Earth's temperature fluctuates which means that polar ice caps form and dissolve over eons. Enter a cold period, ice caps form sopping up fresh water like sponges from the ocean. The ocean level drops, exposing our beautiful coral to air - Viola! You have the Florida Keys. But wait, they aren't islands at all, but a long coral peninsula. If you put on your "back-in-time travel glasses," and look at Florida Bay, you see no water at all but solid ground where Florida Bay should be. Looking at Hawk's Channel (ocean-side) you see marsh instead. During the last 6,000 years, polar caps melt/ refreeze, but sea levels gradually



rise, Florida Bay fills in. Hawk's Channel floods, separating our inner and our outer Reefs. And with the right conditions, coral begins growing again. ("right conditions" is paramount. In this era, water temperatures are warmer than normal causing coral stress and dying. Another story.) Right under you now is

a half-mile of ancient sea coral rock. You could safely say we are at the top of a coral forest. Around Ocean Reef, look carefully at rocks, walls and buildings - you'll be surprised. You can find fossil coral from long, long ago. Pretty fun! Or snorkel/dive to see the living offspring just offshore!







A Sound of the Season

The Red-Shouldered Hawk photographed here by Jim Wilson is one of our regulars here at The Reef. This hawk is best known for its repeated piercing calls (some would say screams) coming from the sky or a perch high in a tree typically in the spring season. The calls are used both as a mating signal and also to announce territory rights. Judging from the photo, a local found success with their noisy

Found throughout the eastern part of the United States, during spring at The Reef we have our fulltime residents as well as migrants. The migrants are one

reason for the sounding off about territorial and mating rights. Everyone wants in on the local action.

These hawks forage for small reptiles or mammals and occasionally other birds. Normally they still hunt from a perch such as a tree limb, the roof of a house or a wire. Using their incredibly sharp vision they can spot a small lizard in the grass from yards away and will drop silently down for a quick meal. Hawks capture their pray primarily by using their razor sharp talons. Most other birds use their bills for foraging.

Red-shouldered Hawks, their

sub-species and their immature offspring, come in several different plumages. Regardless of being the occasional early morning alarm clock they were here long before we arrived. They are also good neighbors that provide environmentally friendly pest control without digging up the yard.

The Academy Shines on Stage









COAST GUARD AUXILIARY BOATING SAFETY

Boardings at Sea

Not everyone experiences a US Coast Guard boarding at sea, but on motor vessel Jupiter we have enjoyed three, the most recent in 2021 near Juneau, Alaska. Jupiter seems to attract the Coast Guard like salmon attracts bears.

The Coast Guard has sweeping authority to board any vessel (subject to the jurisdiction of the United States) at any time at any place. It does not require a warrant. It does not require probable cause. Boardings need not be based on suspicion of an existing violation.

Our experience in Alaska begins with a Defender Class boat coming up fast on our port quarter with blue lights flashing and a radio call on Channel 16:

- -Jupiter, this is the US Coast Guard at your stern.
 - -We reply.
- -When was the last time you were boarded?
 - -It's been about two years.
 - -We're coming aboard.

Maintain your course and speed.

We don PFDs. It is nearly calm in the channel leading southeast. We are making 6 knots. Fiona is at the helm.

I move outside to the cockpit to observe the Coast Guard boat come along side and dispatch two Coast Guardsmen onto Jupiter. The boarding team of petty officers is all boots, life jackets, guns and gear. They are going to inspect our vessel, and they mean business.

While I facilitate the requested

inspection of our bilges, eyes are interrogating Fiona. Is she really in charge of the boat? Of course. She is a licensed mariner.

I open all bilge hatches. The Guardsman is checking to see if the boat is taking on water or hiding contraband, and to see if overboard discharge seacocks are closed.

Satisfied that the ship is sound and legal, out comes the clipboard with the vessel safety checklist—nearly identical to that used by Ocean Reef CG Auxiliary Vessel Examiners.

Everything must be seen and tested. All fire extinguishers are located, and the tags checked. Our copy of Rules of the Road is examined to see if it is the current edition. This thorough and unyielding safety check lasts an hour, and there are not many smiles until the end when we receive a satisfactory report.

We mention that we are members of the Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla at Ocean Reef. The Coast Guardsmen are curious about our mission in Florida and our life at sea in Alaska. They thank us for our cooperation.

The Coast Guard Coxswain is expert enough to approach Jupiter's rail within six inches without touching, allowing for a safe disembarkation of visitors.

What Works

Train With the Mindset of an Olympian



Fitness Focus" by Luis Bracamonte, Director of Fitness & Wellness

The Paris Olympics are a few weeks away. Athletes from over 200 countries will compete in 32 sports and 329 medal events. These athletes have trained their bodies and minds to perform at their highest potential. They have dedicated their lives to excellence. Here is what they know and what they do:

They set to conquer discomfort. It is human nature to shy away and retreat from anything uncomfortable, but avoiding difficult things such as exercise has negative consequences. Athletes know that to perform at a high level and achieve optimal results;

they must expose themselves to discomfort frequently and win the battle against it. Comfort feels good at the moment; conquering discomfort creates long-lasting fulfillment.

Practical Application: A daily workout is the perfect stage for battling and conquering discomfort. If you already exercise regularly, increase the duration, intensity, and or complexity of your workouts.

They are consistent in their training and habits. In fitness and sports, consistency is the king of all success factors. Athletes train daily for years, consistently fine-tuning every detail possible. They make small adjustments to their diets, workouts, recovery, sleep, supplementation, and mindset to lay the bricks that build powerhouses. It is more than positive thinking; it is positive action.

Practical Application: In its most basic form, fitness is the maintenance of muscles, bones, tendons, ligaments, cardiovascular systems, brain, and other organs.

It is also an opportunity to increase health, longevity, and performance to the next level. Your basic fitness program should include two or more resistance and cardio training sessions. More is better, but rule number one is creating a program that fits your schedule and allows you to stay consistent week after week.

They adapt and push further. What is challenging on day one gets easier with consistency, focus, and effort. According to the SAID principle, or Specific Adaptation to Imposed Demands, the body will adapt and become more efficient at whatever skill or activity it performs repeatedly with intent. Athletes use this principle to reap rewards from a training program and progressively make it more challenging to continue improving.

Practical Application: If you manage to stay consistent, you will achieve adaption. The next step is to continue challenging the program through duration, intensity, complexity, and adding new elements.

They accept that failure is part of the process. It takes several tries to succeed in something beyond our current limits. We can only increase our chances of achieving significant improvements by accepting that the road to success is long and will include failures. Athletes compete on game day and against themselves in every workout. It is not only the wins that add up, but also the times we push ourselves to get them.

Practical Application:

Adopting new habits can be daunting. Most people succeed by adopting one habit at a time, and it often takes several tries.

Changes in how we eat, sleep, and exercise lead to significant improvements over time. Think of adopting a new habit as riding a wave that gets bigger and stronger with each ride. Powerful wellness habits include exercising daily, minimizing alcohol intake, eating a nutrient-dense diet, engaging in intellectual pursuits, and practicing mindfulness and introspection.

Only a few will experience competing in the Olympic games, but we all can benefit from adopting the same habits and routines. Every day is an opportunity to take another step in our chosen direction.

ORC's Director of Fitness Completes a 12.5-Mile Swim Around Key West

Director of Fitness & Wellness Luis Bracamonte has completed many fitness challenges in his lifetime, from competing with the Peruvian National Swim Team (1991-2000) to completing 29029 Everesting mountain climbing endurance challenges. His latest feat is equally as impressive... swimming around Key West – a solid 12.5 miles – in just five hours.

Naturally, there are questions. Like why? And how?!

Ocean Reef Press: First, the big question... why swim around Key West?

Luis Bracamonte: Many reasons, but primarily a yearning for adventure and the everlasting feeling of fulfillment after accomplishing something difficult.

Last year, I did the 8-mile Swim For Alligator Lighthouse race and that is where I learned about Swim Around Key West - an annual event put on by the College of The Florida Keys. I thought participating would be a great personal challenge. Of the 150 participants, only about 30, myself included, swam the entire 12.5 distance individually, others swam portions as teams. I owe a big thank you to my buddy Abraham Mirabal (Ocean Room and originally Member Fitness Center) who flew from North Carolina for the weekend to be my support kayaker and navigator.

ORP: How did you train for the swim?

LB: I swam about three times per week with each workout averaging 7 to 10 thousand yards. I also ran 2 to 3 times and did 4 to 5 strength workouts per week. Most of my swimming was done in our Fitness Pool.

ORP: What is the longest distance you've swam in one go?

LB: Although I was a competitive swimmer from ages 5 to 21, I never swam this long in one go, so 12.5 miles is my new distance personal record. My longest pool swim was 22,000

yards a few months ago but my goal is to break that personal record this summer. I also plan to continue doing more marathon swims and looking for more swim adventures.

ORP: What were the most challenging parts of this experience and what will you remember most?

LB: The last two miles were the toughest. The water was choppy and the current against us. It was as if the ocean wanted to ensure we gave it the respect it deserved. I had also burned myself fire dancing two days before the swim and kept wondering as to whether the wound in my arm would attract sharks... It didn't, or at least I never noticed. Swimming alongside a cruise ship was pretty special.

And there we have it. In the words of Vice President of Sports & Amenities Mic O'Keeffe, "Too fast for the sharks and too elusive for the jellyfish... Luis did it! Congrats on yet another feat of strength, and a truly remarkable accomplishment!"

TENNIS TIP

Set a Winning Routine



by Jaspal Mahal, Tennis Professional

One of the most common times you'll see players having a ritual is before they serve. This is because you control every aspect of the shot, and grounding yourself with a routine can help you focus. For my own serve, I like to focus on the number of times I bounce the ball on the ground before I toss it.

This helps me block out any distractions through counting my 4 bounces on the first serve and 5 bounces on the second. Then, I take a second to look at the spot I want to hit, and I go into my service motion. I've also seen players adjust their hats, knock the clay out of their shoes, choose a specific side of their racket, or whatever they feel puts them in their comfort zone before a serve.

This can also be emulated on the serve return. For me personally, I like to adjust my strings and walk to the back fence between points. This fits my style of play, as I like to take my time in between points to gather myself. If you like to play faster, you can have a routine at the baseline when you're waiting

for the server to be ready. This could be bouncing in place, swaying back and forth, adjusting your grip or strings, or anything that helps you calm your mind and focus on the next point.

Having a routine can be extremely helpful through a match, especially on stressful points. By having a few things in your prepoint ritual, you gain control of the time you have between points. This grounds you in the moment, gives you time to clear your mind, and then you can visualize what you want to accomplish. 

BRIDGE TIP

Common Rules & Basic Etiquette

That All Bridge Players Should Know

Rules

1. What constitutes a played card?

Whether a card is considered played is different for a declarer and defenders. For declarer it is on or near the table or in a manner as if to be played. For defenders, it is if it is played in a manner that, if the other defender were looking, he could have seen the card. When the director is called, he often asks for a visual representation of the playing of the card.

2. When to Announce a Failure to Alert

It is different for offense and defense. Defenders should not announce a failure to alert until the play of the hand is over lest they give unauthorized information to partner. Declarer should announce his side's failure to alert after the bidding is ended and before the opening lead. Any player should call the director as soon as he realized that he, himself, has failed to alert. This includes mistaken and missing explanations.

3. The explanation of an Alert

When someone says "alert" and you want to know the meaning; the proper statement is "Please explain." Don't ask unless you need useful information at that time otherwise, wait until the biding has ended the partner has led face-down. If you already know the meaning of the alert, do not ask the meaning for partner's edification. When explaining an alert, you should tell the actual meaning of the bid-not the name of the convention. Don't say "Drury"-instead, say, "limit raise." If you are not sure what it means, do not guess.
















